1.16	(3) two high schools in the seven-county metropolitan area with an average enrollment
1.17	of 50 to 100 students per grade level; and
1.18	(4) two high schools outside the seven-county metropolitan area with an average
1.19	enrollment of 50 to 100 students per grade level.
1.20	(b) The department must prioritize funding for schools with a demonstrated culture of
