- 1.2 relating to child care assistance; removing obsolete language; amending Minnesota
- 1.3 Statutes 2022, section 119B.125, subdivision 1b.
- 1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
- 1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 119B.125, subdivision 1b, is amended to read:
- 1.6 Subd. 1b. **Training required.** (a) ~~Effective November 1, 2011,~~ Prior to initial
- 1.7 authorization as required in subdivision 1, a legal nonlicensed family child care provider
- 1.8 must complete first aid and CPR training and provide the verification of first aid and CPR
- 1.9 training to the county. The training documentation must have valid effective dates as of the
- 1.10 date the registration request is submitted to the county. The training must have been provided
- 1.11 by an individual approved to provide first aid and CPR instruction and have included CPR
- 1.12 techniques for infants and children.
- 1.13 ~~(b) Legal nonlicensed family child care providers with an authorization effective before~~
- 1.14 ~~November 1, 2011, must be notified of the requirements before October 1, 2011, or at~~
- 1.15 ~~authorization, and must meet the requirements upon renewal of an authorization that occurs~~
- 1.16 ~~on or after January 1, 2012.~~
- 1.17 ~~(e)~~ (b) Upon each reauthorization after the authorization period when the initial first aid
- 1.18 and CPR training requirements are met, a legal nonlicensed family child care provider must
- 1.19 provide verification of at least eight hours of additional training listed in the Minnesota
- 1.20 Center for Professional Development Registry.
- 1.21 ~~(d)~~ (c) This subdivision only applies to legal nonlicensed family child care providers.
