1.5	Section 1. CITY OF SPRING GROVE; SALES AND USE TAX EXEMPTION FOR

1.7	Subdivision 1. Exemption; refund. (a) The sale and purchase of the following items
1.8	are exempt from sales and use tax imposed under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 297A, if the
1.9	items are used to repair, replace, or otherwise recover from real and personal property
1.10	damage that occurred during the fire on December 22, 2022, in the city of Spring Grove:
1.11	(1) building materials and supplies used or consumed in, and equipment incorporated
1.12	into, the construction, replacement, or repair of real property; and
1.13	(2) capital equipment to replace equipment destroyed in the fire.
1.14	(b) The tax must be imposed and collected as if the rate under Minnesota Statutes, section
