1.8	Section 1. [214.078] PROTECTION FROM CONVERSION THERAPY.
1.9	Subdivision 1. Definition. "Conversion therapy" means any practice by a mental health
1.10	practitioner or mental health professional as defined in section 245.462 that seeks to change
1.11	an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity, including efforts to change behaviors
1.12	or gender expressions or to eliminate or reduce sexual or romantic attractions or feelings
1.13	toward individuals of the same gender. Conversion therapy does not include counseling
1.14	that provides assistance to an individual undergoing gender transition, or counseling that
1.15	provides acceptance, support, and understanding of an individual or facilitates an individual's
1.16	coping, social support, and identity exploration and development, including
1.17	sexual-orientation-neutral interventions to prevent or address unlawful conduct or unsafe
1.18	sexual practices, as long as the counseling does not seek to change an individual's sexual
1.19	orientation or gender identity.
1.20	Subd. 2. Prohibition. (a) No mental health practitioner or mental health professional
1.21	shall engage in conversion therapy with a client younger than 18 years of age or with a
