REAL ID ACT IMPLEMENTATION ASSISTANCE. 1.6 Subdivision 1. **Purpose.** This section provides temporary assistance centers to assist 1.7 permanent driver's license agents with the anticipated increase in the number of Minnesota 1.8 residents seeking REAL ID compliant driver's licenses prior to the federal deadline for full 1.9 REAL ID Act implementation. 1 10 Subd. 2. Temporary agreements for REAL ID Act implementation. (a) 1.11 Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, section 171.061, and Minnesota Rules, chapter 7404, 1.12 the commissioner of public safety may enter into agreements with the Board of Trustees of 1 1 3 the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities and the Board of Regents of the University 1 1 4 of Minnesota to provide temporary appointments to perform driver's license agent functions 1.15 under Minnesota Statutes, section 171.061. 1.16 1.17 (b) An agreement under paragraph (a) must be structured to facilitate effective implementation of REAL ID Act of 2005 compliance under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 1.18 1.19 171, including application and documentation assistance for driver's license and Minnesota identification card applicants. At a minimum, an agreement must provide for background 1.20 checks as required under Minnesota Statutes, section 171.017, hiring and training of 1.21 temporary employees, use of facilities, lease or purchase of equipment, and collection of 1.22
