1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 168A.29, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
1.9	Subdivision 1. Amounts. (a) The department must be paid the following fees:

The department shall not charge these 3.31 applicants any other fee to receive or renew the endorsement. 3.32

(d) In addition to the fee required under paragraph (a), a driver's license agent may charge 3.33 and retain a filing fee as provided under section 171.061, subdivision 4. 3.34

(e) In addition to the fee required under paragraph (a), the commissioner shall charge a 3.35 filing fee at the same amount as a driver's license agent under section 171.061, subdivision 3.36 3.37 4. ## 4.10 **299A.705 DRIVER AND VEHICLE SERVICES ACCOUNTS.**

4.11 Subdivision 1. Vehicle services operating account. (a) The vehicle services operating
4.12 account is created in the special revenue driver and vehicle services fund, consisting of all
4.13 money from the vehicle services fees specified in chapters 168, 168A, and 168D, and any
4.14 other money otherwise donated, allotted, appropriated, or legislated to this the account.

4.15 (b) Funds appropriated are available from this account must be used by the commissioner
4.16 of public safety to administer the vehicle services as specified in chapters 168, 168A, and
4.17 168D, and section 169.345, including:

# 4.18 (1) designing, producing, issuing, and mailing vehicle registrations, plates, emblems,4.19 and titles;

- 4.20 (2) collecting title and registration taxes and fees;
- 4.21 (3) transferring vehicle registration plates and titles;
- 4.22 (4) maintaining vehicle records;
- 4.23 (5) issuing disability certificates and plates;
- 4.24 (6) licensing vehicle dealers;
- 4.25 (7) appointing, monitoring, and auditing deputy registrars; and
- 4.26 (8) inspecting vehicles when required by law.

4.27 Subd. 2. Driver services operating account. (a) The driver services operating account

4.28 is created in the special revenue driver and vehicle services fund, consisting of all money

4.29 collected under chapter 171 and any other money otherwise donated, allotted, appropriated,

4.30 or legislated to the account.

(b) Money in the Funds appropriated from this account must be used by the commissioner
of public safety to administer the driver services specified in chapters 169A and 171,
including the activities associated with producing and mailing drivers' licenses and
identification cards and notices relating to issuance, renewal, or withdrawal of driving and
identification card privileges for any fiscal year or years and for the testing and examination
of drivers.

5.7 Subd. 3. Driver and vehicle services technology account. (a) The driver and vehicle
5.8 services technology account is created in the special revenue driver and vehicle services
5.9 fund, consisting of the technology surcharge collected as specified in chapters 168, 168A,
5.10 and 171; the filing fee revenue collected under section 168.33, subdivision 7; section 168.33
5.11 and any other money otherwise donated, allotted, appropriated, or legislated to this account.

(b) Money in the account is annually appropriated to the commissioner of public safety
to support the research, development, deployment, and maintenance of a driver and vehicle
services information system.

(c) Following completion of the deposit of filing fee revenue into the driver and vehicle 5.15 services technology account as provided under section 168.33, subdivision 7, the 5.16 commissioner shall submit a notification to the chairs and ranking minority members of the 5.17 legislative committees with jurisdiction over transportation policy and finance concerning 5.18 driver and vehicle services information system implementation, which must include 5.19 information on (1) total revenue deposited in the driver and vehicle services technology 5.20 account, with a breakdown by sources of funds; (2) total project costs incurred, with a 5.21 breakdown by key project components; and (3) an estimate of ongoing system maintenance 5.22 costs. 5.23

5.24 Subd. 4. Prohibited expenditures. The commissioner is prohibited from expending
5.25 money from driver and vehicle services accounts created in the special revenue driver and
5.26 <u>vehicle services</u> fund for any purpose that is not specifically authorized in this section or in
5.27 the chapters specified in this section.

### Sec. 5. REVISOR'S INSTRUCTION.

5.29 The revisor of statutes shall change the term "special revenue fund" to "driver and vehicle
 5.30 services fund" wherever the term appears in Minnesota Statutes when referring to the
 5.31 accounts under Minnesota Statutes, section 299A.705.

#### APPENDIX Repealed Minnesota Statutes: SF3806-0

### **168.013 VEHICLE REGISTRATION TAXES.**

Subd. 21. **Technology surcharge.** For every vehicle registration renewal required under this chapter, the commissioner shall collect a surcharge of: (1) \$1.75 until June 30, 2012; and (2) \$1 from July 1, 2012, to June 30, 2016. Surcharges collected under this subdivision must be credited to the driver and vehicle services technology account in the special revenue fund under section 299A.705.
