1.6	Section 1. [174.125] FEDERAL FUNDS LOCAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For purposes of this section, the following terms have
1.8	the meaning given.
1.9	(b) "Commissioner" means the commissioner of transportation.
1.10	(c) "Program" means the federal funds local assistance program established in this
1.11	section.
1.12	Subd. 2. Program established. The commissioner must implement a federal funds local
1.13	assistance program to provide local match aid in an application for federal discretionary or
1.14	competitive grants.
1.15	Subd. 3. Program administration. (a) The commissioner must establish program
1.16	requirements, including but not limited to: eligibility of projects; solicitation procedures;
1.17	an application process that is designed to minimize requirements and applicant burdens and
1.18	to align with federal application requirements; criteria to evaluate applications and select
1.19	aid recipients subject to subdivision 6; procedures to commit and pay financial assistance;
1.20	and a schedule that allows for application, evaluation, and awards of aid on a biannual or

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more frequent basis.

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2.1	(b) The commissioner must make reasonable efforts to publicize each solicitation among
2.2	all eligible grant recipients. The commissioner must assist applicants to create and submit
2.3	applications.
2.4	(c) The commissioner may expend up to five percent of available funds in a fiscal year
2.5	under this section on program administration.
2.6	Subd. 4. Local match aid. (a) From funds made available under the program, the
2.7	commissioner must provide aid to an eligible recipient as provided under subdivision 5.
2.8	The aid may be provided as direct financial assistance or as a commitment to provide a
2.9	specific amount of financial assistance contingent on an award of a federal grant to the
2.10	eligible grant recipient.
2.11	(b) Aid under the program:
2.12	(1) must provide for a match requirement under a federal discretionary or competitive
2.13	grant in a manner that meets federal requirements;
2.14	(2) must be for a transportation-related project, program, or expenditure;
2.15	(3) may equal a portion or the entire amount necessary for the federal match requirement;
2.16	<u>and</u>
2.17	(4) may exceed the amount necessary for the federal match requirement if the
2.18	commissioner determines that an additional local match is:
2.19	(i) materially likely to increase the competitiveness of the federal application; and
2.20	(ii) anticipated to be generally comparable to competing applications for the federal
2.21	grant.
2.22	(c) If a federal grant award amount differs from the amount anticipated at the time of
2.23	application for aid under the program, the commissioner may adjust the aid amount provided
2.24	for the project or leave the aid amount unchanged.
2.25	Subd. 5. Aid recipient eligibility. The following are eligible aid recipients under the
2.26	program:
2.27	(1) a local unit of government, including but not limited to metropolitan planning
2.28	organizations;
2.29	(2) a Tribal government of a Tribe recognized by the United States Department of the
2.30	Interior Bureau of Indian Affairs;
2.31	(3) a partnership of entities identified in clauses (1) and (2); and
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(4) the co	ommissioner on behalf of or acting as the agent of a local unit of government
or a Tribal g	overnment.
Subd. 6.	Project evaluation. The commissioner must establish criteria to evaluate
projects for a	aid under the program. At a minimum, the criteria must provide for prioritization
and project s	selection based on:
(1) the ex	stent to which the project provides an identifiable impact in the following:
(i) impro	vements to traffic safety;
(ii) impro	ovements to pedestrian and bicyclist safety;
(iii) redu	ction in vehicle miles traveled;
(iv) prov	iding for increased use of low-emission or zero-emission vehicles;
(v) reduc	tion in greenhouse gas emissions; and
(vi) incre	eases in equity for transportation facilities or programs in communities that are
historically of	or currently underrepresented in local or regional transportation planning or
projects, incl	luding indigenous communities, communities of color, low-income households,
people with	disabilities, and people with limited English proficiency;
(2) antici	pated competitiveness of the project for a federal grant or the existence of a
	t award for the project;
	urable benefits with respect to transportation system performance targets or
system plans	s; and
(4) align	ment with the transportation system goal under section 174.01, subdivision 2,
<u>clause (9).</u>	
Subd. 7.	Allocation categories. (a) The commissioner must categorize projects into one
of the alloca	tion categories under paragraph (b). For a project that may be reasonably
categorized i	nto more than one of the allocation categories, the commissioner must determine
the allocatio	n category that reflects the predominant purpose of the project.
(b) In each	ch fiscal year in which local match aid is provided under the program, the
commission	er must apportion the aid among the following allocation categories:
(1) 15 pe	recent for local road and bridge projects;
(2) ten pe	ercent for transit projects outside the metropolitan area, as defined in section
473.121, sub	odivision 2;
(3) five p	percent for active transportation projects;

.2 <u>(5)</u> 67 percent	on a flexible basis, which includes projects that are not otherwise

Subd. 8. Legis	lative report. (a) Annually by December 15, the commissioner must

Sec. 2. [174.127] FEDERAL GRANTS TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.
(a) Subject to f	funds made available for purposes of this section, the commissioner must
establish a process	s that provides for technical assistance to a requesting local unit of
government or Tri	ibal government that seeks to evaluate or submit an application for a
federal discretiona	ary grant for a transportation project, program, or expenditure.
(b) As necessa	ry, the commissioner must prioritize requests for technical assistance
based on applican	t capacity to effectively complete a competitive federal grant application
and history of price	or federal grant applications.
(c) Technical a	assistance includes but is not limited to:
(1) providing s	upport for grant writing, analysis, technical review, application finalization,
or similar activitie	<u>es;</u>
(2) providing §	general programmatic or legal information necessary to complete an
application; and

5.3	Sec. 3. APPROPRIATIONS; FEDERAL FUNDS ASSISTANCE.
5.4	(a) \$38,000,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the
5.5	commissioner of transportation for the federal funds local assistance program under
5.6	Minnesota Statutes, section 174.125. This is a onetime appropriation and is available until
5.7	June 30, 2026.
5.8	(b) \$350,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner
5.9	of transportation for federal grants technical assistance under Minnesota Statutes, section

174.127. This amount is added to the annual base for the agency services budget activity.

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
