1.8	Subd. 15. Direct support services workforce. (a) Individuals and families with
1.9	household income equal to or less than 400 percent of the federal poverty guidelines for the
1.10	applicable family size who otherwise are ineligible for MinnesotaCare under subdivision
1.11	7a are eligible for MinnesotaCare without federal participation if an individual in the
1.12	household provides direct support services. "Direct support services" means in-home,
1.13	nonprofessional, long-term services and supports provided to an older adult or person with
1.14	a disability and funded in whole or in part by medical assistance, including by the home
1.15	and community-based waivers, alternative care, the essential community supports program,
1.16	or community support grants.
1.17	(b) The individual who provides direct support services must work 20 hours per week
1.18	providing direct support services for the individual's household to qualify for MinnesotaCare
1.19	under this subdivision. Once a household is eligible for MinnesotaCare under this subdivision,
1.20	the individual providing direct support services may work fewer than 20 hours per week
1.21	providing direct support services for a maximum of four weeks within a single
1.22	redetermination period without the household losing eligibility.
