Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 144E.28, subdivision 7, is amended to read: 1.6 Subd. 7. Renewal. (a) Before the expiration date of certification, an applicant for renewal 1.7 of certification as an EMT shall: 1.8 (1) successfully complete a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation that is approved by 1.9 the board or the licensee's medical director; 1.10 (2) take the United States Department of Transportation EMT refresher course and 1.11 successfully pass the practical skills test portion of the course, or successfully complete 48 1.12 hours of continuing education in EMT programs that are consistent with the United States 1.13 Department of Transportation National EMS Education Standards or its equivalent as 1.14 approved by the board or as approved by the licensee's medical director and pass a practical 1.15 skills test approved by the board and administered by an education program approved by 1.16 the board. The cardiopulmonary resuscitation course and practical skills test may be included 1.17 as part of the refresher course or continuing education renewal requirements; and 1.18 (3) complete at least four hours of training on mental illnesses, de-escalation, and suicide 1.19 prevention that is approved by the board or the licensee's medical director; and 1.20

(b) Before the expiration date of certification, an applicant for renewal of certification as an AEMT or paramedic shall:

- (1) for an AEMT, successfully complete a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation that is approved by the board or the licensee's medical director and for a paramedic, successfully complete a course in advanced cardiac life support that is approved by the board or the licensee's medical director;
- (2) successfully complete 48 hours of continuing education in emergency medical training programs, appropriate to the level of the applicant's AEMT or paramedic certification, that are consistent with the United States Department of Transportation National EMS Education Standards or its equivalent as approved by the board or as approved by the licensee's medical director. An applicant may take the United States Department of Transportation Emergency Medical Technician refresher course or its equivalent without the written or practical test as approved by the board, and as appropriate to the applicant's level of certification, as part of the 48 hours of continuing education. Each hour of the refresher course, the cardiopulmonary resuscitation course, and the advanced cardiac life-support course counts toward the 48-hour continuing education requirement; and
- (3) complete at least four hours of training on mental illnesses, de-escalation, and suicide prevention that is approved by the board or the licensee's medical director; and
- (3) (4) complete a board-approved application form.
