544.453	HA3 .04H	Copeland	Identical to HCS HB 2246, relating to factors to be considered when setting bail or conditions of release for a defendant.
556.046	HA7 .05H	Evans	Identical to HB 2589, which relates to jury instructions on lesser-included offenses.
565.184	HA2 HA 13 .47H	E. Lewis	Identical to HCS HB 2601, related to the protection of vulnerable persons.
566.010	HA4 .06H	Evans	Identical to HB 2586. Amends definition of “sexual contact”.
566.086	HA4 .06H	Evans	Identical to HB 2586. Adds coaches, assistant coaches, directors, etc., to those who can be convicted of the offense of sexual contact with a student.
566.151	HA10 .25H	J. Coleman	Identical to HCS HB 2616, related to the offense of enticement of a child.

566.155	HA1 to HA4 .12H	Owen	Identical to HB 2112, which adds those who have been convicted of a tier III sexual offense to the list of people who can't serve as an athletic coach or trainer for a sports team a child under 18 (increased from 17) is on and the bill also adds that those on the list can't supervise or employ someone under 18 years old.

This section amends the offense of stealing to add to the C felony penalty when the stolen property is a teller machine or the contents of a teller machine. Also adds HCS HB 2574, related to catalytic converters. This section changes the factors for determining the offense of stealing.
