## FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** state they will hold meetings to facilitate stakeholders as they develop social studies academic performance standards/learning standards for the state (Code 1490): \$44,600 (K-6 = \$22,300; 7-12 = \$22,300).

**Oversight** will show the costs as estimated by DESE.

In addition, **Oversight** assumes there could be costs for school districts for staff training or curriculum based on new learning standards and compliance with the other requirements of this proposal.

**Oversight** did not receive any responses from school districts related to the fiscal impact of this proposal. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information available. Upon the receipt of additional responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval to publish a new fiscal note.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, school districts were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

### FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

## **FISCAL DESCRIPTION**

This bill outlines specific knowledge, skills, and competencies that the State Board of Education (SBE) is required to include in the performance and learning standards for social studies curriculum. Any social studies courses using the performance and learning standards in a developed curriculum are further restricted as outlined in the bill, which limits, among other things, political activism and participation in public policy internships.

The bill prohibits teachers, administrators, and employees of state agencies, school districts, and charter schools from certain actions and from requiring any course relating to specified concepts as described in the bill.

The bill restricts state agencies, school districts, and charter schools from private funding for curriculum, training, or professional development related to specified concepts outlined in the bill and prohibits the punishment of students for any student discussion on those concepts.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
