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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Sections 393.170-523.262 - Compensation for Agricultural and Horticultural Land

Oversight assumes this proposal adds fair market value specifications in condemnation proceedings for agricultural and horticultural land.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation (MODOT)** state this legislation would likely cause several properties that would not be subject to homestead or heritage value to still receive 150% of the value they would have received prior to this legislation. A large percentage of rural district development will require acquisition of property that will qualify as "agricultural or horticultural land" and that will result in the Commission being required to pay an additional 50% of the costs they would have previously had to pay.

MoDOT assumes a potential Unknown negative fiscal impact to MoDOT/MHTC, specifically the State Road Fund.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a potential unknown fiscal impact to the State Road Fund, depending on condemnation proceedings. Oversight assumes a fiscal impact that could exceed the \$250,000 threshold.

Officials from the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Attorney General's Office, the Department of Natural Resources, the Missouri Department of Conservation and the Missouri Department of Transportation each assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Office of Administration** and the **Hancock Street Light District** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

In response to a similar proposal from last year (HB 527), officials from the Cass County Pwsd, the Corder Water/Wastewater District, the Festus Water Department, the Glasgow Village Sld, the High Point Elementary School District, the Hughesville Water/Wastewater District, the Lexington Water/Wastewater District, the Little Blue Valley Sewer District, the Schell City Water Department, the South River Drainage District and the Tri County Water Authority each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

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Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other utilities were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

Oversight assumes this proposal could impact the Grain Belt Express project in northern Missouri. According to a report by the Public Service Commission (File No. EM-2019-0150), the Grain Belt Express Project line is "sited to traverse Buchanan, Clinton Caldwell, Carroll, Chariton, Randolph, Monroe and Ralls Counties, Missouri. The Grain Belt Express Project covers approximately 780 miles, and the project will primarily use a pole design which has a smaller footprint than traditional alternating current transmission lines. The structures will occupy ten acres for the entire state of Missouri." The Joint Application of Invenergy Transmission LLC, Invenergy Investment Company LLC, Grain Belt Express Clean Line LLC and Grain Belt Express Holding LLC for an Order Approving the Acquisition by Invenergy Transmission LLC of Grain Belt Express Clean Line LLC was approved by the PSC effective June 30, 2019.

Oversight notes that while there may be no direct impact to the state or local governments as a result of this proposal, modifying provisions relating to the power of eminent domain for utility purposes could have a large indirect impact on current and future utility projects.

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FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

Small utility businesses and/or small businesses that are impacted by eminent domain could be impacted by this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies that, before the Public Service Commission (PSC) issues an approval for the construction of certain utility infrastructure, the utility corporation must provide the PSC with a resolution of support passed by the county commission in each county through which the merchant line will operate.

The bill also specifies that in condemnation proceedings, just compensation for agricultural or horticultural land shall begin with 150% of fair market value for the most productive category of land and decrease by 5% for each category thereafter. In a condemnation proceeding for agricultural or horticultural land in which a court appoints three disinterested commissioners, the commissioners must be a county commissioner, a farmer who has been farming in the county for at least 10 years, and a state licensed or state-certified appraiser.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
