HB 2083 -- MINIMUM FEES

SPONSOR: Porter

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Transportation by a vote of 11 to 0.

This bill provides that the State Highway Patrol may charge a minimum fee of \$5 for any records request where there are currently allowable fees of less than \$5. The \$5 fee will be in place of any allowable fees of less than \$5. The superintendent of the State Highway Patrol may increase this minimum fee by no more than \$1 every two years beginning on August 28, 2023. This minimum fee shall not exceed \$10.

Additionally, a request for public records to the State Highway Patrol shall be considered withdrawn if the requester fails to pay all required fees within 30 days of a request for payment.

This bill is the same as SB 761 (2022).

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that these fees will help support the electronic modernization Highway Patrol records and reports.

Testifying for the bill were Representative Porter; Lieutenant Collin M. Stosberg, Missouri State Highway Patrol; Missouri Insurance Coalition; and Tyler Hobbs, Missouri Department Of Public Safety.

OPPONENTS: Those who oppose the bill say that they are opposed to any bill that raises fees.

Testifying against the bill was Arnie C. Dienoff.
