

HB 2210 -- CRIMINAL JUSTICE

This bill adds to the definition of "persistent offender" one who has been previously found guilty of a dangerous felony as defined in Section 556.061, RSMo.

Currently, the offense of resisting arrest, detention, or stop is a class E felony if the person resisting does so by fleeing and creates a substantial risk of serious physical injury or death. This bill adds that it is also a class E felony if a person flees by operating a motor vehicle.

The bill adds to rights of victims of crimes the right to be informed by the prosecutor regarding post-conviction relief hearings.
