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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§227.299 – Memorial Designations

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT)** assume the following regarding this proposal:

This legislation would eliminate MoDOT's Memorial Application Process for programs set by the Statute.

Those programs affected are:

- MoDOT's Memorial Bridge/Highway Application Process
 - The Application process was established to allow highway/bridge designations to be processed year-round. This is possible due to the Joint Committee on Transportation Oversight meeting thrice yearly. This process allows Missouri highways and bridges to be designated after an individual, organization, and event or place.
- MoDOT's Heroes Way Designation Program Application Process
 - This program was established for Missouri fallen soldiers.
- MoDOT's Drunk Driving Victim (David's Law) Application Process
 - This program is for any victim killed by an individual who was shown to be operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance. MoDOT is the reviewer/approver of all applications.

Eliminating much of the §227.299 statute will remove MoDOT as Program Administrator. Per federal regulations (Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices), memorial signing on state right-of-ways shall be administered by the state's Department of Transportation to guarantee state and federal compliance (sign spacing/sign installation/right-of-way/roadway safety requirements) are conformed to.

MoDOT would not have the authority to review route locations for roadway availability, ownership, right-of-way, sign size availability, or consider additional signage at county lines or major intersections when the designation crosses two or more county lines if not Program Administrator. There will be a sizeable increase of signs erected off state right-of-ways that could cause violations for cities and counties not meeting state and federal regulations, which MoDOT currently administers.

The overall fiscal impact to this legislation is unquantifiable.

Oversight notes, upon further inquiry, MoDOT assumes any fiscal impact would be to federal highway funds. MoDOT is unable to determine how federal funding may be affected from this proposal; therefore, Oversight will reflect a "\$0" (does not affect federal highway funds) or negative "Unknown" (proposal causes compliance issues) to federal highway funds.

<u>§227.810 – Memorial Highway for Annistyn Kate Rackley</u>

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for this section.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

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FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Currently, for memorial highways and bridges to honor an event, place, organization, or person who has been deceased for more than two years, there is an application process to the Department of Transportation that includes collecting signatures from at least 100 persons who support the naming of the highway or bridge. This application process does not apply to fallen law enforcement officers, emergency personnel and members of the Armed Forces killed in the line of duty, Missouri recipients of the Medal of Honor, or state employees killed while serving the state.

This bill removes all of the application requirements, so all memorial highways and bridges go through the same process.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
