FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **City of Kansas City (KC)** assume the legislation could have a negative fiscal impact on Kansas City because if firefighters live outside Kansas City, then the City may lose the revenue from the earnings tax of some of such firefighters' families that reside with the firefighters.

Oversight assumes Kansas City's response is speculative and KC will not incur significant losses related to this proposal. Oversight assumes this change may increase the number of candidates applying for jobs with cities with such residency requirements. Oversight assumes employees working in, but not residing in, the city limits will still be required to pay the earnings tax.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety's Division of Fire Safety** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

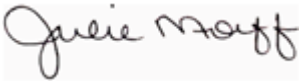
FISCAL DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.

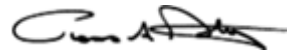
This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
