ASSUMPTION

§§311.660 and 313.220 – Persons found guilty of criminal offenses

Officials from the Missouri Lottery Commission, the City of Kansas City, the City of O'Fallon, and the City of Springfield each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a previous version (HB 2894), officials from the **Department of Public Safety** - **Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control**, the **City of La Monte**, and the **City of St. Louis** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities and counties were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not.
