#### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office (AGO)** state Section 407.955.3 requires the Attorney General to enforce the requirements of Section 407.955. Enforcement will include an investigation of signed complaints submitted by business entities or residents of the state for violations of the section. When a complaint is found to be valid, there may be a need for increased resources and expertise to litigate the complaint. Therefore an AAG II will be required for intake and potential litigation of the complaints. Due to these factors, the AGO assumes this proposal would have a negative fiscal impact of **(\$88,430)** in the first fiscal year, with these costs ongoing in subsequent years.

**Oversight** does not have information to the contrary and therefore, Oversight will reflect the estimates as provided by the AGO.

Officials from the **Department of Commerce and Insurance** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Oversight will assume a \$0 or unknown amount of fine revenue to school districts.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies that the terms of service of an online business must clearly state prohibited acts or conduct that could result in suspension or termination of a user's account, banning a user, or censoring or flagging a user's account or conduct. An online business must require users to agree to these terms separately from other terms of service. If a business changes these terms of service, the changes must be clearly stated and agreed to by the users separately from other terms of service and cannot be retroactively applied to users.

The Attorney General is to enforce the requirements of the bill in the prescribed manner. A first violation of the requirements by an online business is punishable by a fine of \$100, a second violation of the requirements by an online business is punishable by a fine of \$200, and a third or subsequent violation of the requirements by an online business is punishable by a fine of \$1,500.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
