

HCS HJR 69 -- TERM LIMITS FOR MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
(Stephens)

COMMITTEE OF ORIGIN: Standing Committee on Elections and Elected
Officials

Currently, members of the General Assembly can serve no more than
eight years total in any one chamber of the legislature, nor more
than 16 years total.

Upon voter approval and beginning on December 5, 2030, this
resolution would remove the single chamber prohibition, allowing
members of the General Assembly to serve no more than 16 years
total in both chambers of the legislature.

This resolution would also prohibit any individual from serving as
Speaker of the House of Representative for more than three terms or
as President Pro Tem of the Senate for more than two terms.
