FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 394.120 – Rural Electric Cooperatives meetings:

Oversight assumes this part of the proposal is permissive to rural electric cooperatives and would not have a fiscal impact on state agencies or on local political subdivisions.

Section 407.475 – Filing or reporting requirements on certain organizations:

In response to a previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Office of Administration**, Department of Commerce and Insurance, Department of Natural Resources, Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Corrections, Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Mental Health, Department of Social Services, Office of the State Public Defender, Missouri Department of Transportation, Office of the State Auditor, Missouri State Employee's Retirement System, Office of the Attorney General, Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development, Administrative Hearing Commission, Department of Revenue, Department of Public Safety (Fire Safety, Office of the Director, Missouri National Guard, Alcohol and Tobacco Control, Capitol Police, Highway Patrol, Veterans Commission, State Emergency Management Agency, Missouri Gaming Commission), Department of Agriculture, Missouri Ethics Commission, MoDOT & Patrol Employees Retirement System, Office of the State Treasurer, Joint Committee on Legislative Research, Missouri Lottery Commission, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Office of the State Courts Administrator, Missouri State Tax Commission and the University of Missouri each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

In response to a similar proposal (HB 245) from this year, officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives** and the **Missouri Senate** each assumed no fiscal impact from the proposal.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Senate Amendment 1:

Oversight assumes this amendment would not create a fiscal impact.

Rule Promulgation

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The Secretary of State's office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The Secretary of State's office recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, we reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.
