FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** and the **State Auditor=s Office** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations and the State Auditor's Office have each stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes changes to §287.615 remove the ties between DOLIR's Administrative Law Judges (ALJ) salaries to salaries of associate circuit judges, and instead states they are simply subject to appropriation. This in turn, could result in a future increase in salaries paid (if DOLIR decouples from associate circuit judge salaries to pay their ALJs more) or it could result in a savings to the state if DOLIR doesn't allow a future pay increase to their ALJs that associate circuit judges are given. As any future change in ALJ salary would still be a separate decision and subject to appropriation, Oversight will reflect no direct fiscal impact on the fiscal note for this change.
