AN ACT

To repeal section 304.820, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the operation of motor vehicles while using electronic devices, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 304.820, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 304.820, to read as follows:

304.820. 1. [~~Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person twenty-one years of age or younger operating a moving motor vehicle upon the highways of this state shall, by means of a hand-held electronic wireless communications device, send, read, or write a text message or electronic message.~~] **As used in this section, the following terms mean:**

(1) **"Electronic message", a self-contained piece of digital communication that is designed or intended to be transmitted via an electronic wireless communication device including, but not limited to, electronic mail, text messages, instant messages, or commands or requests to access an internet site;**

(2) **"Electronic wireless communication device", includes, but is not limited to, cell phones, personal digital assistants, electronic devices with mobile data access, laptop computers, pagers, broadband personal communication devices, electronic games, or portable computing devices. "Electronic wireless communication device" shall not include global navigation satellite system receivers used for positioning, emergency notification, or navigation purposes, or two-way or citizens band radio services;**

(3) **"Hands-free electronic wireless communication device", an electronic wireless communication device that has an internal feature or function, or that is equipped with an attachment or addition, whether or not permanently part of such**

18 device, by which a user engages with the device without the use of either hand; provided,
19 however, this definition shall not preclude the use of either hand merely to activate,
20 deactivate, or initiate a function of the device;

21 (4) "Highway", any public thoroughfare for vehicles, including state roads;
22 county roads; and public streets, avenues, boulevards, parkways, or alleys in any
23 municipality;

24 (5) "Operating", physically driving or controlling a motor vehicle on a highway,
25 including while temporarily stationary because of traffic, a traffic light, stop sign, or
26 otherwise. A person is not operating a motor vehicle for purposes of this section when
27 the vehicle has pulled over to the side of or off a highway and has stopped in a location
28 where it can safely remain stationary.

29 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 5 or 6 of this section, no person
30 shall operate a noncommercial motor vehicle, as such term is defined in section 302.700,
31 upon the highways of this state while using any hand-held electronic wireless
32 communication device. Prohibited uses include, but are not limited to: reading,
33 composing, viewing, or posting any electronic message; initiating, receiving, or
34 conducting a conversation; or manually entering data into any electronic wireless
35 communication device.

36 3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 5 of this section, no person shall
37 operate a commercial motor vehicle, as such term is defined in section 302.700, while using
38 a hand-held mobile telephone.

39 ~~[3-]~~ 4. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 5 of this section, no person shall
40 operate a commercial motor vehicle, as such term is defined in section 302.700, while using
41 a hand-held wireless ~~[communications]~~ communication device to send, read, or write a text
42 message or electronic message.

43 ~~[4-]~~ 5. The provisions of ~~[subsection 1 through subsection 3]~~ subsections 2 to 4 of
44 this section shall not apply to a person operating:

45 (1) An authorized emergency vehicle, as such term is defined in section 304.022;

47 (2) A motor vehicle that is responding to another motor vehicle's request for
48 roadside assistance upon the highways of this state when such response is conducted in
49 the course and scope of a commercial activity; or

58 ~~[5.]~~ **6.** Nothing in **subsection 2** of this section shall be construed or interpreted [as
59 prohibiting a person from making or taking part in a telephone call, by means of a hand held
60 electronic wireless communications device, while operating a noncommercial motor vehicle
61 upon the highways of this state.

62 ~~6.~~ As used in this section, "electronic message" means a self-contained piece of
63 digital communication that is designed or intended to be transmitted between hand-held
64 electronic wireless communication devices. "Electronic message" includes, but is not limited
65 to, electronic mail, a text message, an instant message, or a command or request to access an
66 internet site.

67 ~~7.~~ As used in this section, "hand held electronic wireless communications device"
68 includes any hand held cellular phone, palm pilot, blackberry, or other mobile electronic
69 device used to communicate verbally or by text or electronic messaging, but shall not apply to
70 any device that is permanently embedded into the architecture and design of the motor
71 vehicle.

72 ~~8.~~ As used in this section, "making or taking part in a telephone call" means listening
73 to or engaging in verbal communication through a hand held electronic wireless
74 communication device.

75 ~~9.~~ As used in this section, "send, read, or write a text message or electronic message"
76 means using a hand held electronic wireless telecommunications device to manually
77 communicate with any person by using an electronic message. Sending, reading, or writing a
78 text message or electronic message does not include reading, selecting, or entering a phone
79 number or name into a hand held electronic wireless communications device for the purpose
80 of making a telephone call] **to prohibit a person operating a noncommercial motor**
81 **vehicle, as such term is defined in section 302.700, on the highways of this state from**
82 **using a hands-free electronic wireless communication device when the operator is not**
83 **holding the hands-free electronic wireless communication device in the operator's hand**
84 **or hands, except the operator shall not have his or her attention diverted from the**
85 **lawful operation of the noncommercial motor vehicle. The provisions of subsection 2 of**
86 **this section shall not prohibit the use of either hand merely to activate, deactivate, or**
87 **initiate a function of a hands-free electronic wireless communication device.**

88 ~~[10.]~~ **7.** A violation of this section shall be deemed an infraction [and shall be]
89 **punishable by a fifty-dollar fine. A violation of this section while operating a motor**
90 **vehicle in a work zone, as such term is defined in section 304.580, when highway**
91 **workers, as such term is defined in section 340.580, are present or in areas designated as**

92 **a school zone that are visibly marked by traffic control devices shall be deemed an**
93 **infraction punishable by a one-hundred-dollar fine. A violation of subsection 2 of this**
94 **section shall not be** deemed a moving violation for purposes of point assessment under
95 section 302.302. **A violation of subsection 3 or 4 of this section shall be deemed a serious**
96 **traffic violation, as defined in section 302.700, for purposes of commercial driver license**
97 **disqualification under section 302.755.**

98 ~~[11.]~~ **8.** The state preempts the field of regulating the use of ~~[hand-held]~~ electronic
99 wireless ~~[communications]~~ **communication** devices ~~[in]~~ **by the operators of** motor vehicles,
100 and the provisions of this section shall supercede any local laws, ordinances, orders, rules, or
101 regulations enacted by a county, municipality, or other political subdivision to regulate the use
102 of ~~[hand-held]~~ electronic wireless communication devices by the operator of a motor vehicle.

103 ~~[12. The provisions of this section shall not apply to:~~

104 ~~(1) The operator of a vehicle that is lawfully parked or stopped;~~

105 ~~(2) Any of the following while in the performance of their official duties: a law~~
106 ~~enforcement officer; a member of a fire department; or the operator of a public or private~~
107 ~~ambulance;~~

108 ~~(3) The use of factory-installed or aftermarket global positioning systems (GPS) or~~
109 ~~wireless communications devices used to transmit or receive data as part of a digital dispatch~~

111 ~~(4) The use of voice-operated technology;~~

112 ~~(5) The use of two-way radio transmitters or receivers by a licensee of the Federal~~

114 **9. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no person under**
115 **eighteen years of age, and no person with an instruction permit or intermediate license**
116 **regardless of age, shall use an electronic wireless communication device, whether hands-**
117 **free or not, while operating a motor vehicle on the highways of this state, except to**
118 **contact emergency services.**

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
