# **HOUSE BILL NO. 1576**

### 98TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

#### INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE HIGDON.

## **AN ACT**

To repeal sections 8.016, 8.051, 8.110, 8.172, and 8.177, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof six new sections relating to the commission on capitol security infrastructure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 8.016, 8.051, 8.110, 8.172, and 8.177, RSMo, are repealed and six new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 8.016, 8.051, 8.110, 8.172, 8.173, and 8.177, to read as follows:

- 8.016. 1. The [commissioner of the office of administration] **commission on capitol security infrastructure** shall provide each member of the senate and each member of the house of representatives with a key that accesses the dome of the state capitol.
- 2. The president pro tem of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives shall be responsible for providing a training program for the members and staff of the general assembly regarding access to secured areas of the capitol building. They may consult with the [office of administration] **commission on capitol security infrastructure** and department of public safety when developing such program.
- 8.051. 1. The [commissioner of administration] **commission on capitol security infrastructure** shall establish a gift shop in the museum of the state capitol.
- 2. The [commissioner] **commission** shall contract with the licensing agent, as defined in section 8.700 to operate the capitol gift shop, as provided in section 8.705; provided, however,
- 5 that the gift shop shall be staffed by persons who are legally blind or otherwise handicapped.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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3. At least fifty percent of the items on sale in the gift shop will be items made, on consignment, by the sheltered workshops operating within the state. "Sheltered workshops" as used in this section shall be defined as in section 178.900.

- 8.110. There is hereby created within the office of administration a "Division of Facilities Management, Design and Construction", which shall supervise the design, construction, renovations, maintenance, and repair of state facilities, except as provided in sections 8.015 [and] , 8.017, and 8.173, and except those facilities belonging to the institutions of higher education, the highways and transportation commission, and the conservation commission, which shall be 6 responsible to review all requests for appropriations for capital improvements. Except as otherwise provided by law, the director of the division of facilities management, design and construction shall be responsible for the management and operation of office buildings titled in the name of the governor. The director shall exercise all diligence to ensure that all facilities within his or her management and control comply with the designated building codes; that they 10 11 are clean, safe and secure, and in proper repair; and that they are adequately served by all necessary utilities. 12
- 8.172. The [commissioner of administration] commission on capitol security

  infrastructure shall make rules and regulations for the regulation of traffic and parking at all

  parking space upon the capitol grounds and upon the grounds of other state buildings located

  within the capital city. The regulations shall be enforced by the Missouri capitol police.
  - 8.173. 1. There is hereby created a "Commission on Capitol Security Infrastructure".
  - 2. The commission shall be composed of the governor, president pro tempore of the senate, and the speaker of the house, or his or her designees.
  - 3. The commission shall oversee the general supervision and charge of the Missouri state capitol building, the state capitol parking garages, and any other state-owned buildings adjacent to or in the immediate vicinity of the state capitol building that house any offices of the general assembly or its staff.
  - 4. The members of the commission shall meet at such times as requested or as necessary to administer the duties bestowed upon them under this section.
- 8.177. 1. The director of the department of public safety shall employ Missouri capitol police officers, as directed by the commission on capitol security infrastructure, for public safety at the seat of state government. Each Missouri capitol police officer, upon appointment, shall take and subscribe an oath of office to support the constitution and laws of the United States and the state of Missouri and shall receive a certificate of appointment, a copy of which shall be filed with the secretary of state, granting such police officers all the same powers of arrest held by other police officers to maintain order and preserve the peace in all state-owned

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8 or leased buildings, and the grounds thereof, at the seat of government and such buildings and grounds within the county which contains the seat of government.

- 2. The director of the department of public safety shall appoint a sufficient number of Missouri capitol police officers, with available appropriations, as appropriated specifically for the purpose designated in this subsection, so that the capitol grounds may be patrolled at all times, and that traffic and parking upon the capitol grounds and the grounds of other state buildings owned or leased within the capital city and the county which contains the seat of government may be properly controlled. Missouri capitol police officers may make arrests for the violation of parking and traffic regulations promulgated by the [office of administration] commission on capitol security infrastructure.
- 3. Missouri capitol police officers shall be authorized to arrest a person anywhere in the county that contains the state seat of government, when there is probable cause to believe the person committed a crime within capitol police jurisdiction or when a person commits a crime in the presence of an on-duty capitol police officer.

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
