AN ACT

To amend chapter 311, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to retail storage and transportation of alcohol.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 311, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 311.367, to read as follows:

311.367. 1. The provisions of this section shall apply to all persons, firms, or corporations who own and operate more than one premises licensed to sell intoxicating liquor containing alcohol in excess of five percent by weight at retail.

2. Any person, firm, or corporation described in subsection 1 of this section, with the permission of the supervisor of alcohol and tobacco control, may designate one or more places in this state as a central warehouse to which intoxicating liquors ordered and purchased by a person, firm, or corporation from licensed wholesalers in this state may be delivered by licensed wholesalers in this state and at which intoxicating liquors so owned by a person, firm, or corporation may be stored.

3. Any person, firm, or corporation described in subsection 1 of this section who owns and stores intoxicating liquors in a central warehouse may transport or transfer all or any part of the intoxicating liquors so stored from the central warehouse in this state to any premises licensed to sell intoxicating liquors at retail that is owned and operated by the same person, firm, or corporation and that is located in the state; provided, however, beer and other intoxicating malt liquor shall not be transferred from the central warehouses to other retail licensed premises due to the perishability and limited life span of beer and intoxicating malt liquor and due to the specific designated geographic areas for the beer
