AN ACT

To repeal section 302.177, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to driver's licenses issued to noncitizens.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 302.177, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 302.177, to read as follows:

302.177. 1. To all applicants for a license or renewal to transport persons or property classified in section 302.015 who are at least twenty-one years of age and under the age of 2 seventy, and who submit a satisfactory application and meet the requirements of sections 3 302.010 to 302.605, the director shall issue or renew such license; except that no license shall 4 be issued if an applicant's license is currently suspended, cancelled, revoked, disqualified, or 5 6 deposited in lieu of bail. Such license shall expire on the applicant's birthday in the sixth year 7 of issuance, unless the license must be issued for a shorter period due to other requirements of 8 law or for transition or staggering of work as determined by the director. The license must be 9 renewed on or before the date of expiration, which date shall be shown on the license.

10 2. To all applicants for a license or renewal to transport persons or property classified 11 in section 302.015 who are less than twenty-one years of age or greater than sixty-nine years of 12 age, and who submit a satisfactory application and meet the requirements of sections 302.010 to 302.605, the director shall issue or renew such license; except that no license shall be issued 13 14 if an applicant's license is currently suspended, cancelled, revoked, disqualified, or deposited in lieu of bail. Such license shall expire on the applicant's birthday in the third year of issuance, 15 16 unless the license must be issued for a shorter period due to other requirements of law or for 17 transition or staggering of work as determined by the director. The license must be renewed on

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18 or before the date of expiration, which date shall be shown on the license. A license issued under 19 this section to an applicant who is over the age of sixty-nine and contains a school bus 20 endorsement shall not be issued for a period that exceeds one year.

21 3. To all other applicants for a license or renewal of a license who are at least twenty-one 22 years of age and under the age of seventy, and who submit a satisfactory application and meet the requirements of sections 302.010 to 302.605, the director shall issue or renew such license; 23 24 except that no license shall be issued if an applicant's license is currently suspended, cancelled, 25 revoked, disqualified, or deposited in lieu of bail. Such license shall expire on the applicant's 26 birthday in the sixth year of issuance, unless the license must be issued for a shorter period due 27 to other requirements of law or for transition or staggering of work as determined by the director. The license must be renewed on or before the date of expiration, which date shall be shown on 28 29 the license.

30 4. To all other applicants for a license or renewal of a license who are less than 31 twenty-one years of age or greater than sixty-nine years of age, and who submit a satisfactory 32 application and meet the requirements of sections 302.010 to 302.605, the director shall issue 33 or renew such license; except that no license shall be issued if an applicant's license is currently 34 suspended, cancelled, revoked, disqualified, or deposited in lieu of bail. Such license shall 35 expire on the applicant's birthday in the third year of issuance, unless the license must be issued 36 for a shorter period due to other requirements of law or for transition or staggering of work as 37 determined by the director. The license must be renewed on or before the date of expiration, 38 which date shall be shown on the license.

5. The fee for a license issued for a period which exceeds three years under subsection1 of this section shall be thirty dollars.

6. The fee for a license issued for a period of three years or less under subsection 2 of this section shall be fifteen dollars, except that the fee for a license issued for one year or less which contains a school bus endorsement shall be five dollars, except renewal fees shall be waived for applicants seventy years of age or older seeking school bus endorsements.

45 7. The fee for a license issued for a period which exceeds three years under subsection46 3 of this section shall be fifteen dollars.

8. The fee for a license issued for a period of three years or less under subsection 4 ofthis section shall be seven dollars and fifty cents.

9. Beginning July 1, 2005, the director shall not issue a driver's license for a period that
exceeds an applicant's lawful presence in the United States. The director may establish
procedures to verify the lawful presence of the applicant and establish the duration of any driver's
license issued under this section. Any license issued to a noncitizen for the limited duration

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53 of his or her lawful presence in the United States shall have a distinguishing mark on the

54 front of the license that specifies the individual is a "noncitizen".

55 10. The director of revenue may adopt any rules and regulations necessary to carry out 56 the provisions of this section. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated pursuant to the authority 57 of this section shall become effective unless it has been promulgated pursuant to the provisions 58 of chapter 536.

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
