## AN ACT

To amend chapter 302, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to driver's license fee offices.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Chapter 302, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 302.737, to read as follows:

**302.737. 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in order to comply with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration application requirements of 49 CFR Part 383.73(m) that require at least two persons within a driver licensing agency to check and verify all documents involved in the licensing process for the initial issuance, renewal, upgrade, or transfer of a commercial learner's permit or a commercial driver's license, each fee office shall establish a system of document verification that allows for a one-business day review on days in which a fee office is staffed by only one person. Specifically, on any day in which a fee office has only one staff person working, that person shall scan all documents needing verification and forward such documentation to the department of revenue main office for review and verification; such verification shall be conducted by a supervisor at the department of revenue and documents returned within one business day of the fee office's initial request.**

**2. The department of revenue may promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any**

18 of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay  
19 the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held  
20 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted  
21 after August 28, 2016, shall be invalid and void.

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
