AN ACT

To repeal section 302.169, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to Selective Service System registration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 302.169, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 302.169, to read as follows:

302.169. 1. Any [male applicant] United States citizen or immigrant who applies

- for a driver's license instruction permit, [o+] driver's license, or renewal of any such permit or license [and] who is [at least eighteen years of age but] less than twenty-six years of age shall
- 4 [also be allowed to register in compliance] comply with the requirements of Section 3 of the
- 5 Military Selective Service Act, [50 U.S.C. App. Section 453, as amended. The application
- 6 shall provide appropriate space for completion by the applicant to indicate his desire to
- 7 register with the Selective Service] 50 U.S.C. Section 3802, unless the applicant declines to
 - consent to registration as described under subsection 4 of this section.
 - 2. [If the applicant indicates his desire to register with the Selective Service by completing the appropriate section of the application as described in subsection 1 of this
- 11 section, the department of revenue shall forward in an electronic format the necessary
- 12 personal information of such applicants to the Selective Service system.] The applicant's
- 13 signature on the application [and completion of the appropriate section of the application]
- 14 shall serve as an indication that the applicant [is authorizing the department to forward to the
- 15 Selective Service system the necessary information for such registration. The department
- 16 shall notify the applicant at the time of application that the applicant's signature constitutes
- 17 consent to registration with the Selective Service system, if the applicant is not already

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18 registered has either already registered with the Selective Service System or consents to registration if required under federal law.

- 3. [The provisions of this section shall become effective July 1, 2003] The department shall place the following statement on the application: "By signing this application you are consenting to registration with the Selective Service System, if so required by Federal law. If you are under 18 years of age, you will be registered upon attaining 18 years of age."
- 4. The department shall place the following statement on the application: "You may decline to give consent to registration with the Selective Service System by signing the statement below. Those required to register who fail to do so may be denied access to Federal employment; denied access to employment with many state and local governments; denied access to many scholarships and student loans; denied access to Federally funded job training under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (29 U.S.C. Chapter 32); and citizenship proceedings may be delayed up to five (5) years. If required to register, failure to do so is a criminal offense (50 U.S.C. Section 3811).".
- 5. The department shall forward, in electronic format to the Selective Service System, the necessary personal information of the applicants required to comply with the Military Selective Service Act.

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
