AN ACT

To repeal section 86.250, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to police officer retirement.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 86.250, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 86.250, to read as follows:

86.250. Retirement of a member on a service retirement allowance shall be made by the board of trustees as follows:

- (1) Any member may terminate employment as a police officer and actually retire after completing twenty or more years of creditable service or attaining the age of fifty-five upon the member's written application to the board of trustees setting forth at what time, but not more than ninety days subsequent to the execution and filing of the application, the member desires to be retired;
- (2) Any member in service who has attained the age of [sixty-five] seventy shall be 9 terminated as a police officer and actually retired forthwith provided that upon request of the 10 chief of police the board of trustees]; except that, a member may serve over the age of 11 seventy upon approval by the chief of police, who may permit such member to remain in 12 service for periods of not to exceed one year from the date of the last [request from the chief 13 of police approval.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.
