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2 3	WHEREAS, the Marketplace Fairness Act is legislation before the United States Congress that would restore states' sovereign right to enforce state and local sales and use tax laws; and
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5 6 7	WHEREAS , the Supreme Court of the United States ruled in <i>National Ballas Hess v Illinois</i> and in <i>Quill Corp. v. North Dakota</i> that a retailer does not have to collect sales taxes in states where the retailer does not have a physical presence; and
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9 10	WHEREAS , customers of out-of-state retailers have a low compliance rate in paying use taxes on their purchases; and
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12 13	WHEREAS , the internet has made shopping from out-of-state retailers incredibly easy and
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15 16	WHEREAS, more and more citizens are foregoing shopping locally in favor of shopping online and, as a result, are denying states and local jurisdictions sales tax revenue; and
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18 19	WHEREAS , the Marketplace Fairness Act would not affect small businesses and would only place requirements on retailers who have over one million dollars in sales a year; and
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21 22	WHEREAS , the Marketplace Fairness Act would require out-of-state retailers to charge the sales taxes levied in a customer's jurisdiction and to remit that tax to the state; and
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24 25	WHEREAS, the Marketplace Fairness Act has gained the support of sixty-sever cosponsors across twenty-eight states and the District of Columbia: and

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27 28	WHEREAS , support for the Marketplace Fairness Act spans across political parties with forty-two Democratic cosponsors and twenty-five Republican cosponsors; and
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30 31	WHEREAS , some states have had to pass tax increases to compensate for the lost sales tax revenues that the Marketplace Fairness Act would restore; and
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33 34 35 36	WHEREAS, many retailer associations and individual retailers have expressed their support for the Marketplace Fairness Act, including the Alliance for Main Street Fairness, the Retail Industry Leaders Association, Amazon, Best Buy, Bed Bath and Beyond, Barnes & Noble, Dick's Sporting Goods, Foot Locker, Target, Staples, and Walmart:
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38 39 40 41	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-ninth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby urge the United States Congress to take up and pass the Marketplace Fairness Act; and
