JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri an amendment to Article I of the Constitution of Missouri, by adopting one new section relating to the right to hunt and fish.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring therein:

That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on Tuesday next

- 2 following the first Monday in November, 2022, or at a special election to be called by the
- 3 governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of this state, for
- 4 adoption or rejection, the following amendment to Article I of the Constitution of the state of
- 5 Missouri:

Section A. Article I, Constitution of Missouri, is amended by adopting one new 2 section, to be known as Section 36, to read as follows:

Section 36. That hunting and fishing provide exercise, social and emotional

- 2 health, employment opportunities, and nutritious proteins; and that hunters and anglers
- 3 are driving forces supporting Missouri's economy. To protect this important heritage
- 4 and fundamental right, the individual rights of hunters and anglers to engage in hunting
- 5 and harvesting wildlife and fishing by traditional legal means shall be forever
- 6 guaranteed in this state, subject to duly authorized powers of the conservation 7 commission conferred in Article IV, Section 40(a) of the Constitution of Missouri.
- 8 Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent the general assembly from enacting
- 9 general laws that limit the rights of convicted violent felons or those adjudicated by a
- 10 court to be a danger to one's self or others as a result of a mental disorder or mental
- 11 infirmity. This section shall not be construed to modify any provision of common law or
- 12 statute relating to trespass or property rights.
