## **AN ACT**

To repeal sections 630.015 and 630.055, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to the state mental health commission.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

- Section A. Sections 630.015 and 630.055, RSMo, are
- 2 repealed and three new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be
- 3 known as sections 630.015, 630.055, and 630.1150, to read as
- 4 follows:
  - 630.015. 1. The state mental health commission shall
- 2 appoint the director of the department by and with the
- 3 advice and consent of the senate, and the director shall
- 4 serve at the pleasure of the commission.
- 5 2. The commission shall advise the director of the
- 6 department as to all phases of department practices in order
- 7 to make them compatible with professional standards,
- 8 including the following subjects:
- 9 (1) Care, treatment, habilitation and rehabilitation
- 10 facilities and programs;
- 11 (2) Manpower recruitment, development and training;
- 12 (3) Medical and statistical records;
- 13 (4) Operational policies;
- 14 (5) Accessibility of services to promote timely
- 15 treatment in the most efficient and efficacious setting of
- 16 patients with mental illness, mental disorders, intellectual
- 17 disabilities, or developmental disabilities.

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18 3. The commission shall advise the director in the

19 initiation, approval and guidance of research projects and

- 20 distribution of research funds.
- 21 4. The commission shall assist the director in
- 22 establishing, maintaining and reviewing the best possible
- 23 plans, practices, rules and regulations, facilities,
- 24 programs and services which are operated, funded or licensed
- 25 by the department.
  - 630.055. From funds appropriated by the general
- 2 assembly for this purpose, the department may conduct
- 3 research into the causes of mental disorders, developmental
- 4 disabilities and alcohol or drug abuse, into improving
- 5 methods of care, treatment, habilitation and rehabilitation
- 6 for persons affected by such conditions, and the
- 7 stigmatizing effects on persons presently or formerly served
- 8 in the department service delivery system. Insofar as
- 9 practicable, the department shall make use of and cooperate
- 10 with the services and facilities of the various state
- 11 universities and state agencies to conduct its research,
- 12 including, but not limited to, the implementation of section
- 13 **630.1150**.
  - 630.1150. 1. In furtherance of its duties described
- in section 630.015, the state mental health commission shall
- 3 oversee and implement a collaborative project to:
- 4 (1) Assess the incidence and implications of foster
- 5 children and clients of the division of developmental
- 6 disabilities with mental illness, mental disorders,
- 7 intellectual disabilities, or developmental disabilities who
- 8 remain hospitalized without medical justification because
- 9 appropriate postdischarge placement options are unavailable;
- 10 (2) Assess the incidence and implications of foster
- 11 children with mental illness, mental disorders, intellectual

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12 disabilities, or developmental disabilities who remain

- 13 hospitalized without medical justification awaiting
- 14 screening for appropriateness of residential services; and
- 15 (3) Develop recommendations to the director of the
- department of mental health for ensuring that such patients
- 17 receive treatment in the most cost effective and efficacious
- 18 settings consistent with their behavioral health conditions
- 19 and federal and state standards for treatment in the least
- 20 restrictive environment.
- 2. Pursuant to section 630.055, the commission and the
- 22 department of mental health shall:
- 23 (1) Engage with the University of Missouri's Missouri
- 24 institute of mental health described in subsection 4 of
- 25 section 630.003 to compile and analyze data and evaluate
- 26 programs and policies as necessary to develop
- 27 recommendations to the commission regarding policy or
- 28 operational changes; and
- 29 (2) Collaborate with other state agencies, including,
- 30 but not limited to, the MO HealthNet division and the
- 31 children's division of the department of social services.
- 32 3. The commission shall also solicit and consider data
- 33 and recommendations from stakeholders who provide or
- 34 coordinate treatment to, or have responsibility for, such
- 35 foster children and developmentally disabled patients,
- 36 including, but not limited to:
- 37 (1) Hospital social workers and discharge planners;
- 38 (2) Health insurers;
- 39 (3) Psychiatrists and psychologists;
- 40 (4) Hospitals, as defined in section 197.020;
- 41 (5) Skilled nursing facilities and intermediate care
- 42 facilities licensed pursuant to chapter 198;
- 43 (6) Vendors, as defined in section 630.005;

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44 (7) Vulnerable persons or persons under the care and 45 custody of the children's division;

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(8) Consumers; and

members of the general assembly.

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- 47 (9) Public elementary and secondary schools.
- 48 4. The commission shall issue interim reports to the
  49 director by December 31, 2022, and July 1, 2023, and a final
  50 report by December 1, 2023. Copies of each report shall be
  51 concurrently submitted to the director of the MO HealthNet
  52 division and the director of the children's division, the
  53 director of the department of social services, and the
- 55 5. The provisions of this section shall expire on September 1, 2024.

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
