## AN ACT

To repeal sections 227.299, 227.450, 301.020, and 302.171, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof thirty-one new sections relating to military affairs, with penalty provisions.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Sections 227.299, 227.450, 301.020, and  
2 302.171, RSMo, are repealed and thirty-one new sections enacted  
3 in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 41.201, 41.676,  
4 143.1032, 227.299, 227.450, 227.463, 227.464, 227.465, 227.466,  
5 227.467, 227.477, 227.478, 227.486, 227.488, 227.489, 227.490,  
6 227.495, 227.496, 227.497, 227.498, 227.777, 227.780, 227.781,  
7 227.782, 227.783, 227.784, 227.785, 227.793, 301.020, 302.171,  
8 and 1, to read as follows:

**41.201. Service members of the Missouri National Guard  
2 shall be considered state employees for the purposes of  
3 operating state-owned vehicles for official state business  
4 unless the members are called into active federal military  
5 service by order of the President of the United States  
6 pursuant to Title 10 of the United States Code.**

**41.676. The National Guard armory located in or  
2 nearest to Joplin shall be designated as the "Sergeant  
3 Robert Wayne Crow Jr. Memorial Armory".**

**143.1032. 1. In each taxable year beginning on or  
2 after January 1, 2022, each individual or corporation**

3 entitled to a tax refund in an amount sufficient to make a  
4 designation under this section may designate that one dollar  
5 or any amount in excess of one dollar on a single return,  
6 and two dollars or any amount in excess of two dollars on a  
7 combined return, of the refund due be credited to the  
8 Missouri Medal of Honor fund. The contribution designation  
9 authorized by this section shall be clearly and  
10 unambiguously printed on the first page of each income tax  
11 return form provided by this state. If any individual or  
12 corporation that is not entitled to a tax refund in an  
13 amount sufficient to make a designation under this section  
14 wishes to make a contribution to the Missouri Medal of Honor  
15 fund, such individual or corporation may, by separate check,  
16 draft, or other negotiable instrument, send in with the  
17 payment of taxes, or may send in separately, that amount,  
18 clearly designated for the Missouri Medal of Honor fund, the  
19 individual or corporation wishes to contribute. The  
20 department of revenue shall deposit such amount to the  
21 Missouri Medal of Honor fund as provided in subsection 2 of  
22 this section.

23 2. The director of revenue shall deposit at least  
24 monthly all contributions designated by individuals under  
25 this section to the state treasurer for deposit to the  
26 Missouri Medal of Honor fund. The fund shall be  
27 administered by the director of revenue.

28 3. The director of revenue shall deposit at least  
29 monthly all contributions designated by the corporations  
30 under this section, less an amount sufficient to cover the  
31 cost of collection, handling, and administration by the  
32 department of revenue during fiscal year 2021, to the  
33 Missouri Medal of Honor fund.

34           4. A contribution designated under this section shall  
35 only be deposited in the Missouri Medal of Honor fund after  
36 all other claims against the refund from which such  
37 contribution is to be made have been satisfied.

38           5. Moneys deposited in the Missouri Medal of Honor  
39 fund shall be used by the department of transportation to  
40 pay for the costs of the Missouri Medal of Honor signs.

41           6. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund  
42 in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any  
43 interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be  
44 credited to the fund.

227.299. 1. Except as provided in subsection 7 of  
2 this section, an organization or person that seeks a bridge  
3 or highway designation on the state highway system to honor  
4 an event, place, organization, or person who has been  
5 deceased for more than two years shall petition the  
6 department of transportation by submitting the following:

7           (1) An application in a form prescribed by the  
8 director, describing the bridge or segment of highway for  
9 which designation is sought and the proposed name of the  
10 bridge or relevant portion of highway. The application  
11 shall include the name of at least one current member of the  
12 general assembly who will sponsor the bridge or highway  
13 designation. The application may contain written testimony  
14 for support of the bridge or highway designation;

15           (2) A list of at least one hundred signatures of  
16 individuals who support the naming of the bridge or highway;  
17 and

18           (3) A fee to be determined by the commission to cover  
19 the costs of constructing and maintaining the proposed  
20 signs. The fee shall not exceed the cost of constructing  
21 and maintaining each sign.

22           2. All moneys received by the department of  
23 transportation for the construction and maintenance of  
24 bridge or highway signs on the state highway system shall be  
25 deposited in the state treasury to the credit of the state  
26 road fund.

27           3. The documents and fees required under this section  
28 shall be submitted to the department of transportation no  
29 later than November first prior to the next regular session  
30 of the general assembly to be approved or denied by the  
31 joint committee on transportation oversight during such  
32 legislative session.

33           4. The department of transportation shall give notice  
34 of any proposed bridge or highway designation on the state  
35 highway system in a manner reasonably calculated to advise  
36 the public of such proposal. Reasonable notice shall  
37 include posting the proposal for the designation on the  
38 department's official public website, and making available  
39 copies of the sign designation application to any  
40 representative of the news media or public upon request and  
41 posting the application on a bulletin board or other  
42 prominent public place which is easily accessible to the  
43 public and clearly designated for that purpose at the  
44 principal office.

45           5. If the memorial highway designation requested by  
46 the organization is not approved by the joint committee on  
47 transportation oversight, ninety-seven percent of the  
48 application fee shall be refunded to the requesting  
49 organization.

50           6. Two highway signs shall be erected for each bridge  
51 and highway designation on the state highway system  
52 processed under this section. When a named section of a  
53 highway crosses two or more county lines, consideration

54 shall be given by the department of transportation to allow  
55 additional signage at the county lines or major  
56 intersections.

57       7. **(1)** Highway or bridge designations on the state  
58 highway system honoring fallen law enforcement officers,  
59 members of the Armed Forces killed in the line of duty,  
60 **Missouri recipients of the Medal of Honor**, emergency  
61 personnel killed while performing duties relating to their  
62 employment, or state employees killed while serving the  
63 state shall not be subject to the provisions of this section.

64       **(2) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the**  
65 **contrary, beginning August 28, 2021, for designations**  
66 **honoring Missouri Medal of Honor recipients, no fees shall**  
67 **be assessed and all costs associated with such designations**  
68 **shall be funded by the department of transportation.**

69       8. No bridge or portion of a highway on the state  
70 highway system may be named or designated after more than  
71 one event, place, organization, or person. Each event,  
72 place, organization, or person shall only be eligible for  
73 one bridge or highway designation.

74       9. Any highway signs erected for any bridge or highway  
75 designation on the state highway system under the provisions  
76 of this section shall be erected and maintained for a twenty-  
77 year period. After such period, the signs shall be subject  
78 to removal by the department of transportation and the  
79 bridge or highway may be designated to honor events, places,  
80 organizations, or persons other than the current designee.  
81 An existing highway or bridge designation processed under  
82 the provisions of this section may be retained for  
83 additional twenty-year increments if, at least one year  
84 before the designation's expiration, an application to the  
85 department of transportation is made to retain the

86 designation along with the required documents and all  
87 applicable fees required under this section.

88       **10. For persons honored with designations on the state**  
89 **highway system under this chapter after August 28, 2021, the**  
90 **department of transportation shall post a link on its**  
91 **website to biographical information of such persons.**

92       **11.** The provisions of this section shall apply to  
93 bridge or highway designations sought after August 28, 2006.

227.450. The portion of U.S. Highway 60 from the  
2 intersection of State Route 0 to the intersection of [State  
3 Highway 5] **Leadhill Drive** in Wright County shall be  
4 designated the "Spc. Justin Blake Carter Memorial Highway  
5 [for Life]". The department of transportation shall erect  
6 and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway with  
7 the costs to be paid for by private donations.

**227.463. The portion of Interstate 29 from its**  
2 **intersection of Interstate 70/U.S. State Highway 71/40 in**  
3 **Jackson County north to the bridge crossing over Nishnabotna**  
4 **River in Atchison County, except for those portions of**  
5 **Interstate 29 previously designated as of August 28, 2021,**  
6 **shall be designated the "Purple Heart Trail". Costs for**  
7 **such designation shall be paid by private donations.**

**227.464. The portion of Interstate 55 from State**  
2 **Highway 0 in Pemiscot County to U.S. Highway 40 in St. Louis**  
3 **City, except for those portions of Interstate 55 previously**  
4 **designated as of August 28, 2021, shall be designated the**  
5 **"Purple Heart Trail". Costs for such designation shall be**  
6 **paid by private donations.**

**227.465. The portion of Interstate 57 from the**  
2 **Missouri/Illinois state line in Mississippi County**  
3 **continuing south to U.S. State Highway 60/State Highway AA**  
4 **in Scott County shall be designated the "Purple Heart**

5 Trail". Costs for such designation shall be paid by private  
6 donations.

227.466. The portion of Interstate 64 from Interstate  
2 70 from the city of Wentzville in St. Charles County  
3 continuing east to Interstate 55 at the Missouri/Illinois  
4 state line in St. Louis City, except for those portions of  
5 Interstate 64/US40/US61 previously designated as of August  
6 28, 2021, shall be designated the "Purple Heart Trail".  
7 Costs for such designation shall be paid by private  
8 donations.

227.467. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter  
2 to the contrary, a highway's classification as a "Purple  
3 Heart Trail" shall not prevent a segment of such highway  
4 from being additionally designated as a memorial highway.

227.477. The portion of U.S. Business 71 from State  
2 Highway 76 West to State Highway EE in McDonald County shall  
3 be designated the "Army PFC Christopher Lee Marion Memorial  
4 Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and  
5 maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with  
6 the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.478. The portion of U.S. State Highway 160 from  
2 West BYP to County Road 115 in Greene County shall be  
3 designated the "Otis E Moore Memorial Highway". The  
4 department of transportation shall erect and maintain  
5 appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs  
6 to be paid by private donations.

227.486. The portion of U.S. State Highway 60 from CRD  
2 Mockingbird Road continuing east to State Highway PP in  
3 Webster County shall be designated as the "Army SGT Timothy  
4 J Sutton Memorial Highway". The department of  
5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs

6 designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by  
7 private donations.

227.488. The bridge on U.S. State Highway 63 crossing  
2 over Business 63 in Adair County shall be designated the  
3 "U.S. Army SGT Brandon Maggart Memorial Bridge". The  
4 department of transportation shall erect and maintain  
5 appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the costs to  
6 be paid for by private donations.

227.489. The bridge on U.S. Highway 63 crossing over  
2 the BSNF Railroad/Marceline Sub in La Plata in Macon County  
3 shall be designated as the "U.S. Army PFC Adam L Thomas  
4 Memorial Bridge". The department of transportation shall  
5 erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such  
6 bridge, with the costs to be paid for by private donations.

227.490. The bridge on U.S. State Highway 63 crossing  
2 over Patterson Street in Adair County shall be designated as  
3 the "U.S. Army SFC Matthew C Lewellen Memorial Bridge". The  
4 department of transportation shall erect and maintain  
5 appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the costs to  
6 be paid for by private donations.

227.495. The portion of U.S. State Highway 54 from  
2 State Highway E to State Highway D in Cole County shall be  
3 designated as the "U.S. Army Specialist Michael Campbell  
4 Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall  
5 erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such  
6 highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.496. The portion of State Highway T from .05 miles  
2 west of Laretto Ridge Drive to Decker Road in the town of  
3 Labadie in Franklin County shall be designated as "Medal of  
4 Honor PVT George Phillips Memorial Highway". The department  
5 of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs



6 designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by the  
7 department.

227.497. The portion of U.S. State Highway 63 from  
2 Spruce Street to McKay Street within the city of Macon in  
3 Macon County shall be designated as the "US Army Sergeant  
4 Hugh C Dunn Memorial Highway". The department of  
5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs  
6 designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by  
7 private donations.

227.498. The portion of Interstate 64 from Winghaven  
2 Boulevard to Prospect Road within the city of Lake St. Louis  
3 in St. Charles County shall be designated as "US Navy SEAL  
4 Scotty Wirtz Memorial Highway". The department of  
5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs  
6 designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by  
7 private donations.

227.777. The bridge on State Highway 17 crossing over  
2 the BSNF Railroad south of the city of Crocker in Pulaski  
3 County shall be designated as "US Navy FA Paul Akers Jr  
4 Memorial Bridge". The department of transportation shall  
5 erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such  
6 bridge, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.780. The portion of State Highway 163 from Stadium  
2 Boulevard/State Highway 740 continuing south to Mick Deaver  
3 Drive in Boone County shall be designated as "PFC Dale  
4 Raymond Jackson Memorial Highway". The department of  
5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs  
6 designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by  
7 private donations.

227.781. The portion of State Highway 163 from Mick  
2 Deaver Drive to Old Route K in Boone County shall be  
3 designated as "Corporal Steven Lee Irvin Memorial Highway".

4 The department of transportation shall erect and maintain  
5 appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs  
6 to be paid by private donations.

227.782. The portion of State Highway 163 from Old  
2 Route K to Green Meadows Drive in Boone County shall be  
3 designated as "CPL Daniel Joseph Heibel Memorial Highway".  
4 The department of transportation shall erect and maintain  
5 appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs  
6 to be paid by private donations.

227.783. The portion of State Highway 163 from Green  
2 Meadows Drive to Nifong in Boone County shall be designated  
3 as "LCPL Larry Harold Coleman Memorial Highway". The  
4 department of transportation shall erect and maintain  
5 appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs  
6 to be paid by private donations.

227.784. The bridge on U.S. State Highway 63 crossing  
2 over Beaver Creek in Phelps County shall be designated as  
3 "VFW Post 2025 Memorial Bridge". The department of  
4 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs  
5 designating such bridge, with the costs to be paid by  
6 private donations.

227.785. The bridge on State Highway 21 crossing over  
2 the Current River in Ripley County shall be designated as  
3 "Veterans Memorial Bridge". The department of  
4 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs  
5 designating such bridge, with the costs to be paid by  
6 private donations.

227.793. The portion of Interstate 44 from State  
2 Highway 744/N. MulRoy Road continuing east to RA IS 44  
3 Strafford/Greene County Line in Greene County shall be  
4 designated the "Nathanael Greene Highway". The department of  
5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs

6 **designating such highway, with the cost to be paid for by**  
7 **private donations.**

301.020. 1. Every owner of a motor vehicle or  
2 trailer, which shall be operated or driven upon the highways  
3 of this state, except as herein otherwise expressly  
4 provided, shall annually file, by mail or otherwise, in the  
5 office of the director of revenue, an application for  
6 registration on a blank to be furnished by the director of  
7 revenue for that purpose containing:

8 (1) A brief description of the motor vehicle or  
9 trailer to be registered, including the name of the  
10 manufacturer, the vehicle identification number, the amount  
11 of motive power of the motor vehicle, stated in figures of  
12 horsepower and whether the motor vehicle is to be registered  
13 as a motor vehicle primarily for business use as defined in  
14 section 301.010;

15 (2) The name, the applicant's identification number  
16 and address of the owner of such motor vehicle or trailer;

17 (3) The gross weight of the vehicle and the desired  
18 load in pounds if the vehicle is a commercial motor vehicle  
19 or trailer.

20 2. If the vehicle is a motor vehicle primarily for  
21 business use as defined in section 301.010 and if such  
22 vehicle is ten years of age or less and has less than one  
23 hundred fifty thousand miles on the odometer, the director  
24 of revenue shall retain the odometer information provided in  
25 the vehicle inspection report, and provide for prompt access  
26 to such information, together with the vehicle  
27 identification number for the motor vehicle to which such  
28 information pertains, for a period of ten years after the  
29 receipt of such information. This section shall not apply  
30 unless:

31           (1) The application for the vehicle's certificate of  
32 ownership was submitted after July 1, 1989; and

33           (2) The certificate was issued pursuant to a  
34 manufacturer's statement of origin.

35           3. If the vehicle is any motor vehicle other than a  
36 motor vehicle primarily for business use, a recreational  
37 motor vehicle, motorcycle, motortricycle, autocycle, bus, or  
38 any commercial motor vehicle licensed for over twelve  
39 thousand pounds and if such motor vehicle is ten years of  
40 age or less and has less than one hundred fifty thousand  
41 miles on the odometer, the director of revenue shall retain  
42 the odometer information provided in the vehicle inspection  
43 report, and provide for prompt access to such information,  
44 together with the vehicle identification number for the  
45 motor vehicle to which such information pertains, for a  
46 period of ten years after the receipt of such information.  
47 This subsection shall not apply unless:

48           (1) The application for the vehicle's certificate of  
49 ownership was submitted after July 1, 1990; and

50           (2) The certificate was issued pursuant to a  
51 manufacturer's statement of origin.

52           4. If the vehicle qualifies as a reconstructed motor  
53 vehicle, motor change vehicle, specially constructed motor  
54 vehicle, non-USA-std motor vehicle, as defined in section  
55 301.010, or prior salvage as referenced in section 301.573,  
56 the owner or lienholder shall surrender the certificate of  
57 ownership. The owner shall make an application for a new  
58 certificate of ownership, pay the required title fee, and  
59 obtain the vehicle examination certificate required pursuant  
60 to subsection 9 of section 301.190. If an insurance company  
61 pays a claim on a salvage vehicle as defined in section  
62 301.010 and the owner retains the vehicle, as prior salvage,

63 the vehicle shall only be required to meet the examination  
64 requirements under subsection 10 of section 301.190.  
65 Notarized bills of sale along with a copy of the front and  
66 back of the certificate of ownership for all major component  
67 parts installed on the vehicle and invoices for all  
68 essential parts which are not defined as major component  
69 parts shall accompany the application for a new certificate  
70 of ownership. If the vehicle is a specially constructed  
71 motor vehicle, as defined in section 301.010, two pictures  
72 of the vehicle shall be submitted with the application. If  
73 the vehicle is a kit vehicle, the applicant shall submit the  
74 invoice and the manufacturer's statement of origin on the  
75 kit. If the vehicle requires the issuance of a special  
76 number by the director of revenue or a replacement vehicle  
77 identification number, the applicant shall submit the  
78 required application and application fee. All applications  
79 required under this subsection shall be submitted with any  
80 applicable taxes which may be due on the purchase of the  
81 vehicle or parts. The director of revenue shall  
82 appropriately designate "Reconstructed Motor Vehicle",  
83 "Motor Change Vehicle", "Non-USA-Std Motor Vehicle", or  
84 "Specially Constructed Motor Vehicle" on the current and all  
85 subsequent issues of the certificate of ownership of such  
86 vehicle.

87 5. Every insurance company that pays a claim for  
88 repair of a motor vehicle which as the result of such  
89 repairs becomes a reconstructed motor vehicle as defined in  
90 section 301.010 or that pays a claim on a salvage vehicle as  
91 defined in section 301.010 and the owner is retaining the  
92 vehicle shall in writing notify the owner of the vehicle,  
93 and in a first party claim, the lienholder if a lien is in  
94 effect, that he is required to surrender the certificate of

95 ownership, and the documents and fees required pursuant to  
96 subsection 4 of this section to obtain a prior salvage motor  
97 vehicle certificate of ownership or documents and fees as  
98 otherwise required by law to obtain a salvage certificate of  
99 ownership, from the director of revenue. The insurance  
100 company shall within thirty days of the payment of such  
101 claims report to the director of revenue the name and  
102 address of such owner, the year, make, model, vehicle  
103 identification number, and license plate number of the  
104 vehicle, and the date of loss and payment.

105 6. Anyone who fails to comply with the requirements of  
106 this section shall be guilty of a class B misdemeanor.

107 7. An applicant for registration may make a donation  
108 of one dollar to promote a blindness education, screening  
109 and treatment program. The director of revenue shall  
110 collect the donations and deposit all such donations in the  
111 state treasury to the credit of the blindness education,  
112 screening and treatment program fund established in section  
113 209.015. Moneys in the blindness education, screening and  
114 treatment program fund shall be used solely for the purposes  
115 established in section 209.015; except that the department  
116 of revenue shall retain no more than one percent for its  
117 administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this  
118 subsection is voluntary and may be refused by the applicant  
119 for registration at the time of issuance or renewal. The  
120 director shall inquire of each applicant at the time the  
121 applicant presents the completed application to the director  
122 whether the applicant is interested in making the one dollar  
123 donation prescribed in this subsection.

124 8. An applicant for registration may make a donation  
125 of one dollar to promote an organ donor program. The  
126 director of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit

127 all such donations in the state treasury to the credit of  
128 the organ donor program fund as established in sections  
129 194.297 to 194.304. Moneys in the organ donor fund shall be  
130 used solely for the purposes established in sections 194.297  
131 to 194.304, except that the department of revenue shall  
132 retain no more than one percent for its administrative  
133 costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is  
134 voluntary and may be refused by the applicant for  
135 registration at the time of issuance or renewal. The  
136 director shall inquire of each applicant at the time the  
137 applicant presents the completed application to the director  
138 whether the applicant is interested in making the one dollar  
139 donation prescribed in this subsection.

140 **9. An applicant for registration may make a donation**  
141 **of one dollar to the Missouri Medal of Honor recipients**  
142 **fund. The director of revenue shall collect the donations**  
143 **and deposit all such donations in the state treasury to the**  
144 **credit of the Missouri Medal of Honor recipients fund as**  
145 **established in Section 1 of this Act. Moneys in the Medal**  
146 **of Honor recipients fund shall be used solely for the**  
147 **purposes established in Section 1 of this Act, except that**  
148 **the department of revenue shall retain no more than one**  
149 **percent for its administrative costs. The donation**  
150 **prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may be**  
151 **refused by the applicant for registration at the time of**  
152 **issuance or renewal. The director shall inquire of each**  
153 **applicant at the time the applicant presents the completed**  
154 **application to the director whether the applicant is**  
155 **interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in**  
156 **this subsection.**

302.171. 1. The director shall verify that an  
2 applicant for a driver's license is a Missouri resident or

3 national of the United States or a noncitizen with a lawful  
4 immigration status, and a Missouri resident before accepting  
5 the application. The director shall not issue a driver's  
6 license for a period that exceeds the duration of an  
7 applicant's lawful immigration status in the United States.  
8 The director may establish procedures to verify the Missouri  
9 residency or United States naturalization or lawful  
10 immigration status and Missouri residency of the applicant  
11 and establish the duration of any driver's license issued  
12 under this section. An application for a license shall be  
13 made upon an approved form furnished by the director. Every  
14 application shall state the full name, Social Security  
15 number, age, height, weight, color of eyes, sex, residence,  
16 mailing address of the applicant, and the classification for  
17 which the applicant has been licensed, and, if so, when and  
18 by what state, and whether or not such license has ever been  
19 suspended, revoked, or disqualified, and, if revoked,  
20 suspended or disqualified, the date and reason for such  
21 suspension, revocation or disqualification and whether the  
22 applicant is making a one dollar donation to promote an  
23 organ donation program as prescribed in subsection 2, **to**  
24 **promote a blindness education, screening and treatment**  
25 **program as prescribed in subsection 3, or the Missouri Medal**  
26 **of Honor recipients fund prescribed in subsection 4** of this  
27 section. A driver's license, nondriver's license, or  
28 instruction permit issued under this chapter shall contain  
29 the applicant's legal name as it appears on a birth  
30 certificate or as legally changed through marriage or court  
31 order. No name change by common usage based on common law  
32 shall be permitted. The application shall also contain such  
33 information as the director may require to enable the  
34 director to determine the applicant's qualification for



35 driving a motor vehicle; and shall state whether or not the  
36 applicant has been convicted in this or any other state for  
37 violating the laws of this or any other state or any  
38 ordinance of any municipality, relating to driving without a  
39 license, careless driving, or driving while intoxicated, or  
40 failing to stop after an accident and disclosing the  
41 applicant's identity, or driving a motor vehicle without the  
42 owner's consent. The application shall contain a  
43 certification by the applicant as to the truth of the facts  
44 stated therein. Every person who applies for a license to  
45 operate a motor vehicle who is less than twenty-one years of  
46 age shall be provided with educational materials relating to  
47 the hazards of driving while intoxicated, including  
48 information on penalties imposed by law for violation of the  
49 intoxication-related offenses of the state. Beginning  
50 January 1, 2001, if the applicant is less than eighteen  
51 years of age, the applicant must comply with all  
52 requirements for the issuance of an intermediate driver's  
53 license pursuant to section 302.178. For persons mobilized  
54 and deployed with the United States Armed Forces, an  
55 application under this subsection shall be considered  
56 satisfactory by the department of revenue if it is signed by  
57 a person who holds general power of attorney executed by the  
58 person deployed, provided the applicant meets all other  
59 requirements set by the director.

60 2. An applicant for a license may make a donation of  
61 one dollar to promote an organ donor program. The director  
62 of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit all such  
63 donations in the state treasury to the credit of the organ  
64 donor program fund established in sections 194.297 to  
65 194.304. Moneys in the organ donor program fund shall be  
66 used solely for the purposes established in sections 194.297

67 to 194.304 except that the department of revenue shall  
68 retain no more than one percent for its administrative  
69 costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is  
70 voluntary and may be refused by the applicant for the  
71 license at the time of issuance or renewal of the license.  
72 The director shall make available an informational booklet  
73 or other informational sources on the importance of organ  
74 and tissue donations to applicants for licensure as designed  
75 by the organ donation advisory committee established in  
76 sections 194.297 to 194.304. The director shall inquire of  
77 each applicant at the time the licensee presents the  
78 completed application to the director whether the applicant  
79 is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed  
80 in this subsection and whether the applicant is interested  
81 in inclusion in the organ donor registry and shall also  
82 specifically inform the licensee of the ability to consent  
83 to organ donation by placing a donor symbol sticker  
84 authorized and issued by the department of health and senior  
85 services on the back of his or her driver's license or  
86 identification card as prescribed by subdivision (1) of  
87 subsection 1 of section 194.225. A symbol may be placed on  
88 the front of the license or identification card indicating  
89 the applicant's desire to be listed in the registry at the  
90 applicant's request at the time of his or her application  
91 for a driver's license or identification card, or the  
92 applicant may instead request an organ donor sticker from  
93 the department of health and senior services by application  
94 on the department of health and senior services' website.  
95 Upon receipt of an organ donor sticker sent by the  
96 department of health and senior services, the applicant  
97 shall place the sticker on the back of his or her driver's  
98 license or identification card to indicate that he or she

99 has made an anatomical gift. The director shall notify the  
100 department of health and senior services of information  
101 obtained from applicants who indicate to the director that  
102 they are interested in registry participation, and the  
103 department of health and senior services shall enter the  
104 complete name, address, date of birth, race, gender and a  
105 unique personal identifier in the registry established in  
106 subsection 1 of section 194.304.

107 3. An applicant for a license may make a donation of  
108 one dollar to promote a blindness education, screening and  
109 treatment program. The director of revenue shall collect  
110 the donations and deposit all such donations in the state  
111 treasury to the credit of the blindness education, screening  
112 and treatment program fund established in section 209.015.  
113 Moneys in the blindness education, screening and treatment  
114 program fund shall be used solely for the purposes  
115 established in section 209.015; except that the department  
116 of revenue shall retain no more than one percent for its  
117 administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this  
118 subsection is voluntary and may be refused by the applicant  
119 for the license at the time of issuance or renewal of the  
120 license. The director shall inquire of each applicant at  
121 the time the licensee presents the completed application to  
122 the director whether the applicant is interested in making  
123 the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.

124 4. **An applicant for registration may make a donation**  
125 **of one dollar to the Missouri Medal of Honor recipients**  
126 **fund. The director of revenue shall collect the donations**  
127 **and deposit all such donations in the state treasury to the**  
128 **credit of the Missouri Medal of Honor recipients fund as**  
129 **established in Section 1 of this Act. Moneys in the Medal**  
130 **of Honor recipients fund shall be used solely for the**

131 purposes established in Section 1 of this Act, except that  
132 the department of revenue shall retain no more than one  
133 percent for its administrative costs. The donation  
134 prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may be  
135 refused by the applicant for registration at the time of  
136 issuance or renewal. The director shall inquire of each  
137 applicant at the time the applicant presents the completed  
138 application to the director whether the applicant is  
139 interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in  
140 this subsection.

141 5. Beginning July 1, 2005, the director shall deny the  
142 driving privilege of any person who commits fraud or  
143 deception during the examination process or who makes  
144 application for an instruction permit, driver's license, or  
145 nondriver's license which contains or is substantiated with  
146 false or fraudulent information or documentation, or who  
147 knowingly conceals a material fact or otherwise commits a  
148 fraud in any such application. The period of denial shall  
149 be one year from the effective date of the denial notice  
150 sent by the director. The denial shall become effective ten  
151 days after the date the denial notice is mailed to the  
152 person. The notice shall be mailed to the person at the  
153 last known address shown on the person's driving record.  
154 The notice shall be deemed received three days after mailing  
155 unless returned by the postal authorities. No such  
156 individual shall reapply for a driver's examination,  
157 instruction permit, driver's license, or nondriver's license  
158 until the period of denial is completed. No individual who  
159 is denied the driving privilege under this section shall be  
160 eligible for a limited driving privilege issued under  
161 section 302.309.

162           [5.] 6. All appeals of denials under this section  
163 shall be made as required by section 302.311.

164           [6.] 7. The period of limitation for criminal  
165 prosecution under this section shall be extended under  
166 subdivision (1) of subsection 3 of section 556.036.

167           [7.] 8. The director may promulgate rules and  
168 regulations necessary to administer and enforce this  
169 section. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated pursuant  
170 to the authority of this section shall become effective  
171 unless it has been promulgated pursuant to chapter 536.

172           [8.] 9. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter  
173 that requires an applicant to provide proof of Missouri  
174 residency for renewal of a noncommercial driver's license,  
175 noncommercial instruction permit, or nondriver's license, an  
176 applicant who is sixty-five years and older and who was  
177 previously issued a Missouri noncommercial driver's license,  
178 noncommercial instruction permit, or Missouri nondriver's  
179 license is exempt from showing proof of Missouri residency.

180           [9.] 10. Notwithstanding any provision of this  
181 chapter, for the renewal of a noncommercial driver's  
182 license, noncommercial instruction permit, or nondriver's  
183 license, a photocopy of an applicant's United States birth  
184 certificate along with another form of identification  
185 approved by the department of revenue, including, but not  
186 limited to, United States military identification or United  
187 States military discharge papers, shall constitute  
188 sufficient proof of Missouri citizenship.

189           [10.] 11. Notwithstanding any other provision of this  
190 chapter, if an applicant does not meet the requirements of  
191 subsection 8 of this section and does not have the required  
192 documents to prove Missouri residency, United States  
193 naturalization, or lawful immigration status, the department

194 may issue a one-year driver's license renewal. This one-  
195 time renewal shall only be issued to an applicant who  
196 previously has held a Missouri noncommercial driver's  
197 license, noncommercial instruction permit, or nondriver's  
198 license for a period of fifteen years or more and who does  
199 not have the required documents to prove Missouri residency,  
200 United States naturalization, or lawful immigration status.  
201 After the expiration of the one-year period, no further  
202 renewal shall be provided without the applicant producing  
203 proof of Missouri residency, United States naturalization,  
204 or lawful immigration status.

**Section 1. 1. There is hereby created in the state**  
2 **treasury the "Missouri Medal of Honor Recipients Fund". The**  
3 **fund shall consist of moneys donated pursuant to sections**  
4 **301.020, 302.171, and 143.1032. All monies shall be**  
5 **received by the department of revenue and either upon**  
6 **request or, at a minimum, on a monthly basis be transferred**  
7 **to the department of transportation. Unexpended balances in**  
8 **the fund at the end of any fiscal year shall not be**  
9 **transferred to the general revenue fund or any other fund,**  
10 **the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary**  
11 **notwithstanding. Moneys in the fund shall be used to pay**  
12 **any renewal fee for a memorial bridge or memorial highway**  
13 **signs for Missouri Medal of Honor recipients, and for the**  
14 **maintenance and repair of all such signs whether originally**  
15 **paid for by private donations or by the department of**  
16 **transportation.**

17 **2. The department of revenue shall provide**  
18 **notification by way of memorandum, to the department of**  
19 **transportation informing the department of transportation of**  
20 **the payment transfer to the credit of the State Road fund,**  
21 **with the memorandum indicating the payment amount, payment**

22 date, payment account number, and the names or names of the  
23 Missouri Medal of Honor recipient or recipients for which  
24 the payment is made.
