AN ACT

To repeal sections 302.173, 306.127, 306.532, and 577.073, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof four new sections relating to transportation, with existing penalty provisions and an emergency clause for certain sections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 302.173, 306.127, 306.532, and 577.073, RSMo, are

- 2 repealed and four new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections
- 3 302.173, 306.127, 306.532, and 577.073, to read as follows:

302.173. 1. Any applicant for a license, who does not possess a valid

- 2 license issued pursuant to the laws of this state, another state, or a country
- 3 which has a reciprocal agreement with the state of Missouri regarding the
- 4 exchange of licenses pursuant to section 302.172 shall be examined as herein
- 5 provided. Any person who has failed to renew such person's license on or before
- 6 the date of its expiration or within six months thereafter must take the complete
- 7 examination. Any active member of the armed forces, their adult dependents or
- 8 any active member of the peace corps may apply for a renewal license without
- 9 examination of any kind, unless otherwise required by sections 302.700 to
- 10 302.780, provided the renewal application shows that the previous license had not
- 11 been suspended or revoked. Any person honorably discharged from the armed
- 12 forces of the United States who held a valid license prior to being inducted may
- 13 apply for a renewal license within sixty days after such person's honorable
- 14 discharge without submitting to any examination of such person's ability to safely

operate a motor vehicle over the highways of this state unless otherwise required 16 by sections 302.700 to 302.780, other than the vision test provided in section 302.175, unless the facts set out in the renewal application or record of 17 18 convictions on the expiring license, or the records of the director show that there is good cause to authorize the director to require the applicant to submit to the 19 20 complete examination. No applicant for a renewal license shall be required to submit to any examination of his or her ability to safely operate a motor vehicle 2122over the highways of this state unless otherwise required by sections 302.700 to 23 302.780 or regulations promulgated thereunder, other than a test of the applicant's ability to understand highway signs regulating, warning or directing 2425 traffic and the vision test provided in section 302.175, unless the facts set out in the renewal application or record of convictions on the expiring license, or the 26 records of the director show that there is good cause to authorize the director to 2728 require the applicant to submit to the complete examination. The examination shall be made available in each county. Reasonable notice of the time and place 29 of the examination shall be given the applicant by the person or officer designated 30 to conduct it. The complete examination shall include a test of the applicant's 31 32 natural or corrected vision as prescribed in section 302.175, the applicant's ability to understand highway signs regulating, warning or directing traffic, the 33 34 applicant's practical knowledge of the traffic laws of this state, and an actual 35 demonstration of ability to exercise due care in the operation of a motor vehicle of the classification for which the license is sought. When an applicant for a 36 37 license has a license from a state which has requirements for issuance of a license 38 comparable to the Missouri requirements or a license from a country which has a reciprocal agreement with the state of Missouri regarding the exchange of 39 licenses pursuant to section 302.172 and such license has not expired more than 40 six months prior to the date of application for the Missouri license, the director 41 may waive the test of the applicant's practical knowledge of the traffic laws of 42this state, and the requirement of actual demonstration of ability to exercise due 43 care in the operation of a motor vehicle. If the director has reasonable grounds 44 to believe that an applicant is suffering from some known physical or mental 45 46 ailment which ordinarily would interfere with the applicant's fitness to operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways, the director may require that the 47 48 examination include a physical or mental examination by a licensed physician of the applicant's choice, at the applicant's expense, to determine the fact. The 49 director shall prescribe regulations to ensure uniformity in the examinations and 50

in the grading thereof and shall prescribe and furnish all forms to the members of the highway patrol and to other persons authorized to conduct examinations as may be necessary to enable the officer or person to properly conduct the examination. The records of the examination shall be forwarded to the director who shall not issue any license hereunder if in the director's opinion the applicant is not qualified to operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways of this state.

- 2. Beginning July 1, 2005, when the examiner has reasonable grounds to believe that an individual has committed fraud or deception during the examination process, the license examiner shall immediately forward to the director all information relevant to any fraud or deception, including, but not limited to, a statement of the examiner's grounds for belief that the person committed or attempted to commit fraud or deception in the written, skills, or vision examination.
- 3. The director of revenue shall delegate the power to conduct the examinations required for a license or permit to any member of the highway patrol or any person employed by the highway patrol. The powers delegated to any examiner may be revoked at any time by the director of revenue upon notice.
- 4. Notwithstanding the requirements of subsections 1 and 3 of this section, the successful completion of a motorcycle rider training course approved pursuant to sections 302.133 to 302.137 shall constitute an actual demonstration of the person's ability to exercise due care in the operation of a motorcycle or motortricycle, and no further driving test shall be required to obtain a motorcycle or motortricycle license or endorsement.
- 5. Notwithstanding the requirements of subsections 1 and 3 of this section, the successful completion of a military motorcycle rider training course that meets or exceeds the Motorcycle Safety Foundation curriculum standards by an applicant who is an active member of the U.S. armed forces, shall constitute an actual demonstration of the person's ability to exercise due care in the operation of a motorcycle or motortricycle, and no further driving test shall be required to obtain a motorcycle or motortricycle license or endorsement. The director of revenue is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations for the administration and implementation of this subsection including rules governing the presentment of motorcycle training course completion

cards from a military motorcycle rider training course or other 86 87 documentation showing that the applicant has successfully completed a course in basic motorcycle safety instruction that meets or exceeds 88 curriculum standards established by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation 89 or other national organization whose purpose is to improve the safety 90 of motorcyclists on the nation's streets and highways. Any rule or 91 portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that is 92created under the authority delegated in this section shall become 93effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions 94 of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and 95 chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the 96 general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, to review, to delay the 97 effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held 98 99 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2012, shall be invalid and void. 100

306.127. 1. Beginning January 1, 2005, every person born after January 1, 1984, or as required pursuant to section 306.128, who operates a vessel on the lakes of this state shall possess, on the vessel, a boating safety identification card issued by the Missouri state water patrol or its agent which shows that he or she has:

- 6 (1) Successfully completed a boating safety course approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators and certified by the 8 Missouri state water patrol. The boating safety course may include a course 9 sponsored by the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary or the United States 10 Power Squadron. The Missouri state water patrol may appoint agents to 11 administer a boater education course or course equivalency examination and issue 12 boater identification cards under guidelines established by the water patrol. The 13 Missouri state water patrol shall maintain a list of approved courses; or
- 14 (2) Successfully passed an equivalency examination prepared by the
 15 Missouri state water patrol and administered by the Missouri state water patrol
 16 or its agent. The equivalency examination shall have a degree of difficulty equal
 17 to, or greater than, that of the examinations given at the conclusion of an
 18 approved boating safety course; or
- (3) A valid master's, mate's, or operator's license issued by the UnitedStates Coast Guard.

- 2. The Missouri state water patrol or its agent shall issue a permanent
- 22 boating safety identification card to each person who complies with the
- 23 requirements of this section which is valid for life unless invalidated pursuant to
- 24 law.
- 25 3. The Missouri state water patrol may charge a fee for such card or any
- 26 replacement card that does not substantially exceed the costs of administrating
- 27 this section. The Missouri state water patrol or its designated agent shall collect
- 28 such fees. These funds shall be forwarded to general revenue.
- 4. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any person who:
- 30 (1) Is licensed by the United States Coast Guard to serve as master of a
- 31 vessel;
- 32 (2) Operates a vessel only on a private lake or pond that is not classified
- 33 as waters of the state;
- 34 (3) Until January 1, 2006, is a nonresident who is visiting the state for
- 35 sixty days or less;
- 36 (4) Is participating in an event or regatta approved by the water patrol;
- 37 (5) Is a nonresident who has proof of a valid boating certificate or license
- 38 issued by another state if the boating course is approved by the National
- 39 Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA);
- 40 (6) Is exempted by rule of the water patrol;
- 41 (7) Is currently serving in any branch of the United States armed forces,
- 42 reserves, or Missouri national guard, or any spouse of a person currently in such
- 43 service; or
- 44 (8) Has previously successfully completed a boating safety education
- 45 course approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators
- 46 (NASBLA).
- 47 5. The Missouri state water patrol shall inform other states of the
- 48 requirements of this section.
- 49 6. No individual shall be detained or stopped strictly for the purpose of
- 50 checking whether the individual possesses a boating safety identification card or
- 51 a temporary boater education permit.
- 52 7. [Beginning January 1, 2006, any nonresident born after January 1,
- 53 1984, desiring to operate a rental vessel on the lakes of this state, may obtain a
- 54 temporary boater education permit by completing and passing a written
- 55 examination developed by the Missouri state water patrol, provided the person

meets the minimum age requirements for operating a vessel in this state. The 56 57 Missouri state water patrol is authorized to promulgate rules for developing the 58examination and any requirements necessary for issuance of the temporary boater 59 education permit. The temporary boater education permit shall expire when the nonresident obtains a permanent identification card pursuant to subsection 2 of 60 this section or thirty days after issuance, whichever occurs first. The Missouri 62 state water patrol may charge a fee not to exceed ten dollars for such temporary permit. Upon successful completion of an examination and prior to renting a 63 64vessel, the business entity responsible for giving the examination shall collect such fee and forward all collected fees to the Missouri state water patrol on a 65 monthly basis for deposit in the state general revenue fund. Such business entity 66 shall incur no additional liability in accepting the responsibility for administering 67 the examination. This subsection shall terminate on December 31, 2010.] Any 68 person or company that rents or sells vessels may issue a temporary 69 boating safety identification card to a nonresident of the state to 70 operate a rented vessel or a vessel being considered for sale, for a 7172period of up to seven days, provided that the individual meets the minimum age requirements for operating a vessel in this state. In 73order to qualify for the temporary boating safety identification card, 74the applicant shall provide a valid driver's license establishing that the 75applicant is a nonresident and shall sign an affidavit that he or she has 76reviewed the Missouri State Highway Patrol Handbook of Missouri 77Boating Laws and Responsibilities. Any nonresident holding a valid 7879 temporary boating safety identification card shall be deemed in compliance with the requirements of this section. The Missouri state 80 highway patrol shall charge a fee of nine dollars for such temporary 81 boating safety identification card. Nonresidents shall not be eligible 82 83 for more than one temporary boating safety identification card. No 84 person or company may issue a temporary boating safety identification 85 card to a nonresident under the provisions of this subsection unless 86 such person or company is capable of submitting the applicant's temporary boating safety identification card information and payment 87 88 in an electronic format as prescribed by the Missouri state highway patrol. The business entity issuing a temporary boating safety 89 identification card to a nonresident under the provisions of this

subsection shall transmit the applicant's temporary boating safety 91 92 identification card information electronically to the Missouri state highway patrol, in a manner and format prescribed by the 93 superintendent, using an electronic online registration process 94 95 developed and provided by the Missouri state highway patrol. The electronic online process developed and provided by the Missouri state 96 highway patrol shall allow the applicant to pay the temporary boating 97 safety identification card fee by credit card or debit 98 99 card. Notwithstanding any provision in section 306.185 to the contrary, 100 all fees collected under the authority of this subsection shall be deposited in the water patrol division fund. The Missouri state 101 highway patrol shall promulgate rules for developing the temporary 102103 boating safety identification card and any requirements necessary to the issuance, processing, and payment of the temporary boating safety 104 identification card. The Missouri state highway patrol shall, by rule, 105 106 develop a boating safety checklist for each applicant seeking a temporary boating safety identification card. The provisions of this 107 108 subsection shall expire on December 31, 2022.

306.532. Effective [January 1, 2011] August 28, 2012, the certificate of title for a new outboard motor shall designate the year the outboard motor was manufactured as the "Year Manufactured" and shall further designate the year the dealer received the new outboard motor from the manufacturer as the "Model Year-NEW". Any outboard motor manufactured on or after July first of any year shall be labeled "Year Manufactured" with the calender year immediately following the year manufactured, unless the manufacturer indicates a specific model or program year.

577.073. 1. It is unlawful for any person to throw waste paper, tin cans, bottles, rubbish of any kind, or contaminate in any manner, any spring, pool or stream within a state park, nor shall any person other than authorized personnel of the department of natural resources cut, prune, pick or deface or injure in any manner the flowers, trees, shrub or any other flora growing on the land or in the water of any state park.

2. No person shall be permitted to offer or advertise merchandise or other goods for sale or hire, or to maintain any concession, or use any park facilities, buildings, trails, roads or other state park property for commercial use except by

written permission or concession contract with the department of natural resources; except that, the provisions of this subsection shall not apply to the normal and customary use of public roads by commercial and noncommercial organizations for the purpose of transporting persons or vehicles, including but not limited to, canoes.

- 3. No object of archaeological or historical value or interest within a state park may be removed, injured, disfigured, defaced or destroyed except by authorized personnel.
- 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section B. Because of the need to protect tourism in this state and ensure that out-of-state residents are knowledgeable in the safe operation of vessels, the repeal and reenactment of sections 306.127 and 577.073 of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and the repeal and reenactment of sections 306.127 and 577.073 of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.
