AN ACT

To repeal sections 50.800, 50.810, 50.815, and 50.820, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to county financial statements, with existing penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Sections 50.800, 50.810, 50.815, and 50.820, Section A. 2 RSMo, are repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 50.815 and 50.820, to read as follows: 3 50.815. 1. On or before the first Monday in March of 2 each year, the county commission of each county of the first 3 [class not having a charter form of government], second, third, or fourth classification shall, with the assistance 4 5 of the county clerk or other officer responsible for the 6 preparation of the financial statement, prepare and publish 7 in some newspaper of general circulation published in the 8 county, as provided under section 493.050, a financial 9 statement of the county for the year ending the preceding 10 December thirty-first. 2. The financial statement shall show at least the 11 12 following: (1) A summary of the receipts of each fund of the 13 14 county for the year; A summary of the disbursements and transfers of 15 (2)16 each fund of the county for the year; 17 A statement of the cash balance at the beginning (3) and at the end of the year for each fund of the county; 18

19 (4) A summary of delinquent taxes and other due bills20 for each fund of the county;

(5) A summary of warrants of each fund of the countyoutstanding at the end of the year;

23 (6) A statement of bonded indebtedness, if any, at the
24 beginning and at the end of the year for each fund of the
25 county; [and]

26 (7) A statement of the tax levies of each fund of the27 county for the year; and

(8) The name, office, and current gross annual salary
 of each elected or appointed county official.

The financial statement need not show specific 30 3. 31 disbursements, warrants issued, or the names of specific 32 payees except to comply with subdivision (8) of subsection 2 33 of this section, but every individual warrant, voucher, receipt, court order and all other items, records, documents 34 35 and other information which are not specifically required to be retained by the officer having initial charge thereof 36 [and which would be required to be included in or to 37 construct a financial statement in the form prescribed for 38 39 other counties by section 50.800] shall be filed on or before the date of publication of the financial statement 40 prescribed by subsection 1 of this section in the office of 41 42 the county clerk[, and]. The county clerk or other officer 43 responsible for the preparation of the financial statement shall preserve the same, shall provide an electronic copy of 44 the data used to create the financial statement without 45 charge to any newspaper requesting a copy of such data, and 46 47 shall cause the same to be available for inspection during normal business hours on the request of any person, for a 48 49 period of five years following the date of filing in his or 50 her office, after which five-year period these records may

51 be disposed of according to law unless they are the subject 52 of a legal suit pending at the expiration of that period.

4. At the end of the financial statement, each
commissioner of the county commission and the county clerk
shall sign and append the following certificate:

We, _____, ____, and _____, duly 56 elected commissioners of the county commission of 57 _____ County, Missouri, and I, 58 , county clerk of that county, certify that the above 59 and foregoing is a complete and correct statement of 60 61 every item of information required in section 50.815 for the year ending December 31, [19] 20 , and 62 we have checked every receipt from every source and 63 every disbursement of every kind and to whom and for 64 what each disbursement was made, and each receipt and 65 disbursement is accurately included in the above and 66 foregoing totals. (If for any reason complete and 67 accurate information is not given the following shall 68 be added to the certificate.) Exceptions: the above 69 report is incomplete because proper information was not 70 available in the following records which are 71 in the keeping of the following officer or officers 72 73 • 74 Date 75 76 77 78 Commissioners, County Commission 79 80 County Clerk

5. Any person falsely certifying to any fact covered
by the certificate is liable on his or her bond and is
guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction thereof, shall be
punished by a fine of not less than two hundred dollars or

85 more than one thousand dollars, or by confinement in the county jail for a period of not less than thirty days nor 86 87 more than six months, or by both such fine and confinement. Any person charged with preparing the financial report who 88 willfully or knowingly makes a false report of any record 89 90 is, in addition to the penalties otherwise provided for in this section, guilty of a felony, and upon conviction 91 92 thereof shall be sentenced to imprisonment by the division of corrections for a term of not less than two years nor 93 94 more than five years.

95 [6. The provisions of sections 50.800 and 50.810 do 96 not apply to counties of the first class not having a 97 charter form of government, except as provided in subsection 98 3 of this section.]

1. The statement required by section 50.815 50.820. 2 shall be set in the standard column width measure which will 3 take the least space and the publisher shall file two proofs 4 of publication with the county commission and the commission 5 shall forward one proof to the state auditor and shall file 6 the other in the office of the commission. As required 7 under section 493.025, a newspaper publishing the statement 8 shall charge and receive no more than its regular local 9 classified advertising rate, which shall be the rate on the 10 newspaper's rate schedule that was offered to the public 11 thirty days before the publication of the statement. The county commission shall [not] pay the publisher [until] upon 12 the filing of proof of publication [is filed] with the 13 commission [and]. After verification, the state auditor 14 [notifies] shall notify the commission that proof of 15 publication has been received and that it complies with the 16 requirements of this section. 17

18 2. The statement shall be spread on the record of the 19 commission and for this purpose the publisher shall be 20 required to furnish the commission with at least two copies 21 of the statement which may be [pasted on] placed in the 22 record.

23 3. The state auditor shall notify the county treasurer immediately of the receipt of the proof of publication of 24 the statement. After the first day of April of each year 25 the county treasurer shall not pay or enter for protest any 26 27 warrant for the pay of any of the county commission until notice is received from the state auditor that the required 28 29 proof of publication has been filed. [Any county treasurer 30 paying or entering for protest any warrant for any commissioner of the county commission prior to the receipt 31 of such notice from the state auditor shall be liable 32 therefor on his official bond.] 33

4. The state auditor shall prepare sample forms for 34 financial statements required by section 50.815 and shall 35 36 [mail] **provide** the same to the county clerk of each county of the first [class not having a charter form of 37 government], second, third, or fourth classification in this 38 state, but failure of the auditor to supply such forms shall 39 40 not in any way excuse any person from the performance of any duty imposed by this section or by section 50.815. If any 41 county officer fails, neglects, or refuses to comply with 42 the provisions of this section or section 50.815 [he], the 43 county officer shall, in addition to other penalties 44 provided by law, be liable on his or her official bond for 45 46 dereliction of duty.

[50.800. 1. On or before the first Monday in March of each year, the county commission of each county of the second, third, or fourth class shall prepare and publish in some newspaper as provided for in section 493.050, if

6 there is one, and if not by notices posted in at 7 least ten places in the county, a detailed financial statement of the county for the year 8 ending December thirty-first, preceding. 9 The statement shall show the bonded 10 2. 11 debt of the county, if any, kind of bonds, date 12 of maturity, interest rate, rate of taxation 13 levied for interest and sinking fund and 14 authority for the levy, the total amount of 15 interest and sinking fund that has been 16 collected and interest and sinking fund on hand 17 in cash. 18 3. The statement shall also show 19 separately the total amount of the county and 20 township school funds on hand and loaned out, 21 the amount of penalties, fines, levies, 22 utilities, forfeitures, and any other taxes 23 collected and disbursed or expended during the 24 year and turned into the permanent school fund, 25 the name of each person who has a loan from the 26 permanent school fund, whether county or township, the amount of the loan, date loan was 27 28 made and date of maturity, description of the 29 security for the loan, amount, if any, of 30 delinquent interest on each loan. 31 4. The statement shall show the total valuation of the county for purposes of 32 33 taxation, the highest rate of taxation the constitution permits the county commission to 34 levy for purposes of county revenue, the rate 35 levied by the county commission for the year 36 37 covered by the statement, division of the rate levied among the several funds and total amount 38 39 of delinquent taxes for all years as of December 40 thirty-first. 41 5. The statement shall show receipts or revenues into each and every fund separately. 42 43 Each fund shall show the beginning balance of 44 each fund; each source of revenue; the total 45 amount received from each source of revenue; the 46 total amount available in each fund; the total 47 amount of disbursements or expenditures from each fund and the ending balance of each fund as 48 49 of December thirty-first. The total receipts or 50 revenues for the year into all funds shall be 51 shown in the recapitulation. In counties with 52 the township form of government, each township 53 shall be considered a fund pursuant to this 54 subsection. 55 6. Total disbursements or expenditures 56 shall be shown for warrants issued in each 57 category contained in the forms developed or 58 approved by the state auditor pursuant to 59 section 50.745. Total amount of warrants, 60 person or vendor to whom issued and purpose for which issued shall be shown except as herein 61 provided. Under a separate heading in each fund 62

the statements shall show what warrants are 63 outstanding and unpaid for the lack of funds on that date with appropriate balance or overdraft 64 65 66 in each fund as the case may be. 67 7. Warrants issued to pay for the service of election judges and clerks of elections shall 68 69 be in the following form: Names of judges and clerks of elections at 70 71 per day (listing the names run in and not listing each name by lines, and at the end 72 of the list of names giving the total of the 73 74 amount of all the warrants issued for such 75 election services). 76 8. Warrants issued to pay for the service 77 of jurors shall be in the following form: Names of jurors at \$ per day (listi the names run in and not listing each name by 78 per day (listing 79 80 lines, and at the end of the list of names 81 giving the total of the amount of all the 82 warrants issued for such election service). 83 9. Warrants to Internal Revenue Service 84 for Social Security and withholding taxes shall 85 be brought into one call. 86 10. Warrants to the director of revenue of 87 Missouri for withholding taxes shall be brought 88 into one call. 89 11. Warrants to the division of employment 90 security shall be brought into one call. 12. Warrants to Missouri local government 91 employees' retirement system or other retirement 92 93 funds for each office shall be brought into one 94 call. 95 Warrants for utilities such as gas, 13. 96 water, lights and power shall be brought into 97 one call except that the total shall be shown 98 for each vendor. 99 14. Warrants issued to each telephone 100 company shall be brought into one call for each 101 office in the following form: 102 (Name of Telephone Company for 103 office and total amount of warrants issued). 104 15. Warrants issued to the postmaster for 105 postage shall be brought into one call for each office in the following form: 106 107 (Postmaster for office and total 108 amount of warrants issued). 16. Disbursements or expenditures by road 109 110 districts shall show the warrants, if warrants 111 have been issued in the same manner as provided for in subsection 5 of this section. If money 112 has been disbursed or expended by overseers the 113 114 financial statement shall show the total paid by the overseer to each person for the year, and 115 116 the purpose of each payment. Receipts or 117 revenues into the county distributive school fund shall be listed in detail, disbursements or 118 119 expenditures shall be listed and the amount of

120 each disbursement or expenditure. If any taxes have been levied by virtue of Section 12(a) of Article X of the Constitution of Missouri the 121 122 123 financial statement shall contain the following: 124 By virtue and authority of the 125 discretionary power conferred upon the county 126 commissions of the several counties of this state to levy a tax of not to exceed 35 cents on 127 the \$100 assessed valuation the county 128 129 commission of County did for the year 130 covered by this report levy a tax rate of 131 cents on the \$100 assessed valuation which said 132 tax amounted to \$ and was disbursed or 133 expended as follows: 134 The statement shall show how the money was disbursed or expended and if any part of the sum 135 136 has not been accounted for in detail under some 137 previous appropriate heading the portion not 138 previously accounted for shall be shown in 139 detail. 140 17. At the end of the statement the person 141 designated by the county commission to prepare the financial statement herein required shall 142 143 append the following certificate: 144 the duly authorized agent Τ. 145 appointed by the county commission of 146 County, state of Missouri, to 147 prepare for publication the financial 148 statement as required by section 50.800, 149 RSMo, hereby certify that I have diligently checked the records of the county and that 150 151 152 153 the above and foregoing is a complete and correct statement of every item of information required in section 50.800, 154 RSMo, for the vear ending December 31, , and especially have I checked every receipt from every source whatsoever and 155 156 every disbursement or expenditure of every kind and to whom and for what each such 157 158 159 disbursement or expenditure was made and 160 that each receipt or revenue and 161 disbursement or expenditure is accurately 162 (If for any reason complete and shown. accurate information is not given the 163 164 following shall be added to the 165 certificate.) Exceptions: The above report is incomplete because proper information was not available in the following records which are in the keeping of the following officer or officers. The person 166 167 168 169 designated to prepare the financial statement shall give in detail any 170 171 172 incomplete data called for by this section. 173 Date 174 Officer designated by county commission to 175 prepare financial statement required by 176 section 50.800, RSMo.

Any person falsely certifying to any fact covered by the certificate is liable on his 184 bond and upon conviction of falsely certifying 185 to any fact covered by the certificate is guilty 186 187 of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not 188 less than two hundred dollars or more than one 189 thousand dollars or by imprisonment in the 190 county jail for not less than thirty days nor 191 more than six months or by both fine and 192 imprisonment. Any person charged with the 193 responsibility of preparing the financial report 194 who willfully or knowingly makes a false report 195 of any record, is, in addition to the penalty 196 otherwise provided for in this law, deemed 197 quilty of a felony and upon conviction shall be 198 sentenced to the penitentiary for not less than 199 two years nor more than five years.]

[50.810. 1. The statement shall be printed in not less than 8-point type, but not more than the smallest point type over 8-point type available and in the standard column width measure that will take the least space. The publisher shall file two proofs of publication with the county commission and the commission shall forward one proof to the state auditor and shall file the other in the office of the commission. The county commission shall not pay the publisher until proof of publication is filed with the commission and shall not pay the person designated to prepare the statement for the preparation of the copy for the statement until the state auditor notifies the commission that proof of publication has been received and that it complies with the requirements of this section.

19 The statement shall be spread on the 2. 20 record of the commission and for this purpose 21 the publisher shall be required to furnish the 22 commission with at least two copies of the 23 statement that may be pasted on the record. The 24 publisher shall itemize the cost of publishing 25 said statement by column inch as properly 26 chargeable to the several funds and shall submit 27 such costs for payment to the county 28 The county commission shall pay out commission. 29 of each fund in the proportion that each item 30 bears to the total cost of publishing said 31 statement and shall issue warrants therefor; 32 provided any part not properly chargeable to any

specific fund shall be paid from the county 33 34 general revenue fund. 35 3. The state auditor shall notify the 36 county treasurer immediately of the receipt of 37 the proof of publication of the statement. 38 After the first of April of each year the county 39 treasurer shall not pay or enter for protest any 40 warrant for the pay of any commissioner of any 41 county commission until notice is received from 42 the state auditor that the required proof of 43 publication has been filed. Any county 44 treasurer paying or entering for protest any 45 warrant for any commissioner of the county 46 commission prior to the receipt of such notice from the state auditor shall be liable on his 47 official bond therefor. 48 4. The state auditor shall prepare sample 49 50 forms for financial statements and shall mail 51 the same to the county clerks of the several 52 counties in this state. If the county 53 commission employs any person other than a 54 bonded county officer to prepare the financial 55 statement the county commission shall require 56 such person to give bond with good and 57 sufficient sureties in the penal sum of one 58 thousand dollars for the faithful performance of 59 his duty. If any county officer or other person 60 employed to prepare the financial statement herein provided for shall fail, neglect, or 61 refuse to, in any manner, comply with the provisions of this law he shall, in addition to other penalties herein provided, be liable on 62 63 64 65 his official bond for dereliction of duty.]
