AN ACT

To repeal sections 565.070 and 565.074, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to crimes of assault, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 565.070 and 565.074, RSMo, are repealed and three

- 2 new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 565.070, 565.074,
- 3 and 565.076, to read as follows:
 - 565.070. 1. A person commits the crime of assault in the third degree if:
- 2 (1) The person attempts to cause or recklessly causes physical injury to
- 3 another person; or
- 4 (2) With criminal negligence the person causes physical injury to another
- 5 person by means of a deadly weapon; or
- 6 (3) The person purposely places another person in apprehension of
- 7 immediate physical injury; or
- 8 (4) The person recklessly engages in conduct which creates a grave risk
- 9 of death or serious physical injury to another person; or
- 10 (5) The person knowingly causes physical contact with another person
- 11 knowing the other person will regard the contact as offensive or provocative; or
- 12 (6) The person knowingly causes physical contact with an incapacitated
- 13 person, as defined in section 475.010, RSMo, which a reasonable person, who is
- 14 not incapacitated, would consider offensive or provocative.
- 15 2. Except as provided in subsections 3 and 4 of this section, assault in the
- 16 third degree is a class A misdemeanor.
- 17 3. A person who violates the provisions of subdivision (3) or (5) of
- 18 subsection 1 of this section is guilty of a class C misdemeanor.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

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- [4. A person who has pled guilty to or been found guilty of the crime of assault in the third degree more than two times against any family or household member as defined in section 455.010, RSMo, is guilty of a class D felony for the third or any subsequent commission of the crime of assault in the third degree when a class A misdemeanor. The offenses described in this subsection may be against the same family or household member or against different family or household members.]
 - 565.074. 1. A person commits the crime of domestic assault in the third degree if the act involves a family or household member or an adult who is or has been in a continuing social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the actor, as defined in section 455.010, RSMo, and:
- 5 (1) The person attempts to cause or recklessly causes physical injury to 6 such family or household member; or
- 7 (2) With criminal negligence the person causes physical injury to such 8 family or household member by means of a deadly weapon or dangerous 9 instrument; or
- 10 (3) The person purposely places such family or household member in 11 apprehension of immediate physical injury by any means; or
 - (4) The person recklessly engages in conduct which creates a grave risk of death or serious physical injury to such family or household member; or
- 14 (5) The person knowingly causes physical contact with such family or 15 household member knowing the other person will regard the contact as offensive; 16 or
- 17 (6) The person knowingly attempts to cause or causes the isolation of such 18 family or household member by unreasonably and substantially restricting or 19 limiting such family or household member's access to other persons, 20 telecommunication devices or transportation for the purpose of isolation.
- 2. Except as provided in subsection 3 of this section, domestic assault in the third degree is a class A misdemeanor.
- [3. A person who has pleaded guilty to or been found guilty of the crime of domestic assault in the third degree more than two times against any family or household member as defined in section 455.010, RSMo, is guilty of a class D felony for the third or any subsequent commission of the crime of domestic assault. The offenses described in this subsection may be against the same family or household member or against different family or household members.]
