To amend chapter 324, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the use of online platforms by health care contractors.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 324, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 one new section, to be known as section 324.049, to read as
- 3 follows:
 - 324.049. 1. For purposes of this section, the
- following terms shall mean:
- 3 (1) "Health care contractor", any person or
- 4 organization, including, but not limited to, an individual,
- 5 corporation, limited liability company, partnership, sole
- 6 proprietor, or other entity, that enters into an agreement
- 7 with a platform in order to use such platform to provide
- 8 services to third-party individuals or third-party entities
- 9 seeking health care services;
- 10 (2) "Health care service", any health care, dental, or
- 11 veterinary service, or any service in support of or related
- 12 to such services;
- 13 (3) "Platform", an organization, including a
- 14 corporation, limited liability company, partnership, sole
- 15 proprietorship, or any other entity, that both:
- (a) Operates a digital website or digital smartphone
- 17 application that facilitates the provision of health care

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18 services to individuals or entities seeking such services;

- 19 **and**
- 20 (b) Accepts requests for health care services only
- 21 through its digital website or digital smartphone
- 22 application and does not accept requests for health care
- 23 services by telephone, by facsimile, or in person at
- 24 physical locations.
- 25 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
- 26 contrary, a health care contractor shall be treated as an
- 27 independent contractor and shall not be treated as an
- 28 employee of a platform for the purposes of all state and
- 29 local laws, regulations, ordinances, and resolutions if:
- 30 (1) The platform and health care contractor agree in
- 31 writing that the health care contractor is an independent
- 32 contractor with respect to the platform;
- 33 (2) The platform does not unilaterally prescribe
- 34 specific hours during which the health care contractor is
- 35 required to be available to accept requests from third-party
- 36 individuals or third-party entities for health care services;
- 37 (3) The health care contractor may accept or reject
- 38 service requests without penalty in any form by the
- 39 platform. This subdivision shall not apply if the health
- 40 care contractor accepts a service request and fails to
- 41 fulfill any of its contractual obligations pursuant to such
- 42 request;
- 43 (4) The platform does not bar the health care
- 44 contractor from engaging in any other occupation or business;
- 45 (5) The platform does not require health care
- 46 contractors to use specific supplies or equipment;
- 47 (6) The platform does not control the means and
- 48 methods for the services performed by a health care
- 49 contractor by requiring the health care contractor to follow

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specified instructions governing the performance of services. However, the platform may require that the quality of the services provided by the health care contractor meet specific standards and requirements;

- (7) The agreement or contract between the health care contractor and the platform may be terminated by either the health care contractor or the platform with or without cause;
- (8) The health care contractor is responsible for the taxes on the health care contractor's own earnings derived from the services performed for third-party individuals or third-party entities through the assignments or connections received from the platform; and
- (9) All, or substantially all, payment to the health care contractor is based on the performance of services for third-party individuals or third-party entities who have engaged the services of the health care contractor through the platform.
- 3. Nothing in this section shall be construed to authorize a health care contractor to provide any health care service for which a license, registration, or certificate is required pursuant to chapters 191, 197, 198, 209, or 324 to 346 if such contractor is not so licensed, registered, or certified.

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
