Description of fiscal impact

HB 275 establishes eligibility for a Driving Privilege Card. Passage of the bill would require Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) to program the Credentialing and Registration System (CARS), perform testing for quality assurance, train Driver Services Bureau (DSB) employees, and have the printing agent design a Driving Privilege Card that can be put into production. The cost would be \$224,110.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions

Department of Justice

- 1. It is estimated, per the current card contractor, changes would be needed to the current system to add the new language of Driving Privilege Card to the existing credential at a cost of \$117,000.
- 2. The CARS system will need to be programmed to include definition, configuration development, and implementation at a cost of \$100,000.
- 3. MVD assumes 20 hours of testing and 20 hours of quality assurance for implementation of a new credential will be required prior to production at a cost of \$1,160.
- 4. MVD assumes the website changes would be needed and a new application created for the Driving Privilege Card at approximately 20 hours at a cost of \$734.
- 5. There would be 3 hours of training required for 66 examiners at DSB stations at a cost of \$4,851. The cost for a trainer would be \$365.
- 6. It is assumed the cost of each Driving Privilege Card would cost \$5.00 per year and have life span of 2 years for a total of \$10 per card.
- 7. The number of individuals that could benefit from the Driving Privilege card cannot be predicted, if half of the 24,600 refugees that are recorded to be in Montana in 2023 meet the requirements and were issued a Driving privilege card the revenue would be \$120,300. This revenue would be deposited in the general fund.
