Description of fiscal impact: SB 315 authorizes but does not require K-12 public school districts to provide age and developmentally appropriate comprehensive sexual health education and consent education to students in the 4th through 12th grades while setting requirements and restrictions on materials that may be used. There is no state fiscal impact related to this bill.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- SB 315 authorizes but does not require school districts to provide age and developmentally appropriate comprehensive sexual health education and consent education to students in the 4th through 12th grades while setting requirements and restrictions on materials that may be used.
- The bill establishes an “opt out” system allowing parents to take a student out of the class by submitting a written request.
- Students and parents must be able to review the curriculum of the education provided under this bill.
- The bill requires school districts to report information on the attendance of students in these courses to the Superintendent of Public Instruction and for the Superintendent of Public Instruction to report a summary of these reports to the legislature.
- The OPI estimates it will take 80 hours of effort to produce a survey, gather the required information, and report to the legislature. The OPI can absorb this cost within existing resources.
