4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROHIBITING THE REGULATION OF CERTAIN FISHING
5	DERBIES; PROHIBITING CONTESTS INVOLVING SPECIES OF CONCERN; PROVIDING EXCEPTIONS; AND
6	AMENDING SECTIONS 23-5-165, 87-3-121, AND 87-6-214, MCA."

8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10	Section 1. Section 23-5-165, MCA, is amended to read:
11	"23-5-165. Fishing derbies and wagering on natural occurrences. (1) The following are authorized
12	gambling activities:
13	(a) subject to 87-3-121, a fishing derby in which two or more persons pay valuable consideration for ar
14	opportunity to win a prize for the species, size, weight, or otherwise specified fish caught in a fishing event; and
15	(b) wagering on the outcome of a natural occurrence in which two or more persons pay valuable
16	consideration for an opportunity to win a prize by most accurately predicting the date or time of an event resulting
17	from a climatological or meteorological activity.
18	(2) Except as provided in subsection (3), all consideration paid to participate in a gambling activity
19	authorized in subsection (1) must be paid to the winners.
20	(3) A nonprofit organization sponsoring a gambling activity authorized in subsection (1) may retain up
21	to 50% of the total amount paid to participate.
22	(4) This section does not apply to a gambling activity conducted under chapter 4 or chapter 5, part 2 or
23	3, of this title."

25	Section 2. Section 87-3-121, MCA, is amended to read:
26	"87-3-121. Regulation of fishing contests. (1) The Except as provided in subsection (3), the
27	commission shall adopt rules to regulate contests, in accordance with the provisions of 87-6-214, by a person
28	firm, or club that intends to offer or give a prize, gift, or anything of value in connection with or as a prize for the
29	taking, capturing, killing, or in any manner acquiring fish that are protected under Title 87. The commission's rules
30	must be based on the commission's duty under Title 87 to protect, preserve, and propagate fish in the state.

(2) Contests involving any species of concern listed in the database maintained by the Montana natural heritage program, except for contests involving lake or reservoir-stocked Yellowstone cutthroat trout (Oncorhynchus clarkii bouvieri) or westslope cutthroat trout (Oncorhynchus clarkii lewisi), including upper Missouri cutthroat trout, are prohibited.

- (3) (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (2), the commission may not regulate a fishing contest involving 50 or fewer persons and offering cash prizes or merchandise worth \$500 or less. Except as provided in subsection (3)(b), participants shall abide by all laws and regulations of the department in effect during the contest.
- (b) During catch-and-release contest hours, fish caught for contest purposes and released alive do not count toward a participant's daily limit. Catch-and-release contest participants may not have more than the daily limit in their possession at any time. All fish caught during a catch-and-release contest must be released alive at the end of the day unless the fish died as a result of handling during the contest."

- **Section 3.** Section 87-6-214, MCA, is amended to read:
- "87-6-214. Unlawful contest or prize. (1) (a) Except as provided in subsections (1)(b) and (1)(c), a person, firm, or club may not offer or give a prize, gift, or anything of value in connection with or as a bag limit prize for the taking, capturing, killing, or in any manner acquiring any game <u>animal</u>, fowl, or fur-bearing animal or any bird or animal protected by law.
- (b) A prize may be awarded for any one game bird or fur-bearing animal on the basis of size, quality, or rarity.
- (c) A person may conduct or sponsor a contest for which the monetary prize, certificate, or award does not exceed \$50 for a person who kills a game animal possessing the largest antlers or horns, carrying the greatest weight, or having the longest body or any similar contest based upon on the size or weight of a game animal or part of a game animal. The monetary restriction provided in this subsection (1)(c) does not apply to recognition given by a nationally established and recognized Boone and Crockett trophy institute.
- (2) A person convicted of <u>or who forfeits bond or bail after being charged with</u> a violation of this section shall be fined not less than \$50 or <u>and not</u> more than \$1,000 or be imprisoned in the county detention center for not more than 6 months, or both. In addition, the person, upon <u>on</u> conviction or forfeiture of bond or bail, may be subject to forfeiture of any current hunting, fishing, or trapping license issued by this state and the privilege to hunt, fish, or and trap in this state or to use state lands, as defined in 77-1-101, for recreational purposes for a
