16	(2) enforce the provisions of this chapter and rules adopted pursuant to this chapter;
17	(3) establish outfitter standards and guide standards;

19	(a) rules to administer and enforce this chapter, including rules prescribing all requisite qualifications for
20	licensure as an outfitter or guide. Qualifications for outfitters may include training, testing, experience, and

(ii) for hunting outfitters, the name and automated licensing system number for each client, the species and sex of each game animal, as defined in 87-2-101, harvested, the date of harvest for each game animal, and the hunting district of each harvest noting if the harvest occurred on private or public land;

- (iii) for fishing outfitters, the name and automated licensing system number for each client and an accounting of each water body fished by date. If the water body fished is a stream, the entry and exit points must be noted.
- (e) rules specifying standards for outfitter's assistants and documentation standards for proof of employment or retention required of outfitter's assistants. The rules may also identify data that may be collected regarding use of outfitter's assistants.
- (5) hold hearings and proceedings to suspend or revoke licenses of outfitters and guides for due cause; and
