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15	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Distribution of lottery revenues. (1) The office of public instruction shall			
16	distribute lottery revenues received pursuant to 23-7-402 on a quarterly basis and within 30 days of receiving			
17	the funds. The funds must be distributed to schools on a per-quality-educator basis, with the amount to be			
18	distributed to each district calculated by dividing the total funds available for distribution by the total number of			
19	quality educators, as defined in 20-4-502, employed by each school district in the state in the immediately			
20	preceding school fiscal year.			
21	(2) A school district receiving funds under this section shall deposit the funds in its flexibility fund			
22	established under 20-9-543.

24	Section 2. Section 20-9-543, MCA, is amended to read:			
25	"20-9-543. School flexibility fund uses. (1) The trustees of a district may establish a school			
26	flexibility fund and may use the fund, in their discretion, for school district expenditures incurred for:			
27	(a) technological equipment enhancements and expansions considered by the trustees to support			
28	enhanced educational programs in the classroom;

1 (b) facility expansion and remodeling considered by the trustees to support the delivery of 2 educational programs, to address health or safety hazards, or to support the removal and replacement of 3 obsolete facilities: 4 (C) supplies and materials considered by the trustees to support the delivery of enhanced 5 educational programs; 6 (d) student assessment and evaluation; 7 (e) the development of curriculum materials; 8 (f) training for classroom staff considered by the trustees to support the delivery of enhanced 9 educational programs; 10 purchase, lease, or rental of real property that must be used to provide free or reduced price (g) 11 housing for classroom teachers; 12 (h) salaries, benefits, bonuses, and other incentives for the recruitment and retention of classroom 13 teachers and other certified staff, subject to collective bargaining when applicable; or 14 increases in energy costs caused by an increase in energy rates from the rates paid by the (i) 15 district in fiscal year 2001 or from increased use of energy as a result of the expansion of facilities, equipment, 16 or other resources of the district. 17 (2) The financial administration of the school flexibility fund must be in accordance with the 18 financial administration provisions of this title for a budgeted fund." 19 20 Section 3. Section 23-7-202, MCA, is amended to read: 21 "23-7-202. Powers and duties of commission. The commission shall: 22 (1) establish and operate a state lottery; 23 (2) determine policies for the operation of the state lottery, supervise the director and the staff, and 24 meet with the director at least once every 3 months to make and consider recommendations, set policies, 25 determine types and forms of lottery and sports wagering games to be operated by the state lottery, and 26 transact other necessary business; 27 (3) maximize the net revenue paid to the state general fund office of public instruction for 28 distribution to schools as provided for in [section 1] and to the Montana STEM scholarship program special

Section 23-7-402, MCA, is amended to read: 8 "23-7-402. Disposition of revenue -- statutory appropriations. (1) A minimum of 45% of the money 9 paid for tickets or chances must be paid out as prize money. The prize money is statutorily appropriated, as 10 provided in 17-7-502, to the state lottery. 11 (2) Commissions paid to lottery ticket or chance sales agents are not a state lottery operating 12 expense. 13 (3) That part of all gross revenue not used for the payment of prizes, commissions, and operating 14 expenses, together with the interest earned on the gross revenue while the gross revenue is in the enterprise 15 fund, is net revenue. Net revenue must be transferred guarterly from the enterprise fund established by 23-7-16 401 in the following order: 17 the first \$2.25 million of net revenue in each fiscal year must be transferred quarterly in equal (a) 18 payments of \$562,500 to the Montana STEM scholarship program special revenue account established in 20-19 26-617; and 20 (b) net revenue in excess of \$2.25 million in each fiscal year must be transferred to the state 21 general fund is statutorily appropriated, as provided in 17-7-502, to the office of public instruction to distribute to 22 schools pursuant to [section 1]. 23 (4) The spending authority of the state lottery may be increased in accordance with this section 24 upon review and approval of a revised operation plan by the office of budget and program planning." 25 26 NEW SECTION.
