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NEW SECTION. Section 3. Reversion of grant money. On July 1, 2027, the unencumbered balance of the grants for the biennium ending June 30, 2027, reverts to the cultural and aesthetic projects trust fund account provided for in 15-35-108.

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NEW SECTION. Section 4. Changes to grants on pro rata basis. Except for the appropriation provided for in [section 1(3)], if money in the cultural and aesthetic projects trust fund account is insufficient to



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1 fund projects at the appropriation levels contained in [section 2], reductions to those projects with funding

2 greater than \$2,000 must be made on a pro rata basis.

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4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Section 5. Effective date.** [This act] is effective July 1, 2025.
