11	Sectio	n 1. Section 15, Chapter 774, Laws of 2023, is amended to read:
12	"Section	on 15. Workforce housing appropriations eligible uses of funds. (1) There is
13	appropriated \$	12 million from the general fund to the board of investments for the biennium beginning July 1,
14	2023. The purp	oose of the funds is to advance the construction or purchase of workforce housing of employees
15	who work at st	ate-owned facilities that house state inmates or behavioral health patients.
16	(2)	Funds must be distributed to assist those who work and are living in counties that have a
17	population of le	ess than 15,000 inhabitants that are located within a 30-mile radius of a state-owned facility that,
18	on an annual a	verage, houses at least 100 state inmates or behavioral health patients, and the state-owned
19	facility is located in a county that has a population that does not exceed 15,000 inhabitants. The distribution	
20	must be made	pro rata based on the annual average state-owned facility population for the fiscal year
21	beginning July	1, 2021, and the number of workers residing in each eligible county.
22	(3)	Eligible uses of the funds include:
23	(a)	buying down construction costs on employee housing;
24	(b)	providing matching funds required pursuant to the state workforce housing community
25	reinvestment organization revolving loan fund;	
26	(c)	providing loans for up to 50% of the projected project cost of an eligible infrastructure project
27	pursuant to [section 13];	
28	(d)	providing funds to discount housing costs to employees who work in state-owned facilities that
