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10	Section 1. Section 7-2-4107, MCA, is amended to read:		
11	"7-2-4	107. Officers elected at first election. (1) At the election provided for in 7-2-4106, there must	
12	be elected:		
13	(a)	in a city of the first class, a mayor, a city judge, a city attorney, a city treasurer, a city marshal,	
14	and <del>two</del> one ci	ty council members member from each ward into which the city is divided;	
15	(b)	in a city of the second class, a mayor, a city judge, a city treasurer, a city marshal, and two city	
16	council members from each ward;		
17	(c)	in a town, a mayor and two city council members from each ward.	
18	(2)	Those elected hold office until the first Monday of January after the first annual election and	
19	until their successors are elected and qualified. The persons elected shall qualify in the manner prescribed by		
20	law for county officers."		
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22	Section 2. Section 7-4-4101, MCA, is amended to read:		
23	"7-4-4	<b>101.</b> Officers of city of first class. (1) The officers of a city of the first class <u>may not</u> consist of	
24	more than:		
25	(a)	one mayor;	
26	(b)	two-one city council members-member from each ward; and	
27	(c)	one city judge.	
28	(2)	Except as provided in 7-5-4410, officers listed in subsection (1) must be elected by the qualified

2 (3) There may also be appointed by the mayor, with the advice and consent of the council:

- 3 (a) one city attorney;
- 4 (b) one city clerk;
- 5 (c) one city treasurer or finance officer or one city clerk-treasurer;

- 8 (f) one street commissioner;
- 9 (g) one city jailer;

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**Section 3.** Section 7-4-4402, MCA, is amended to read:

- "**7-4-4402. Term of office.** (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), a A city council member shall hold office for a term of 4 years and until the qualification of a successor.
  - (2) At the first annual election held after the organization of a city or town under this title, the electors of the city or town shall elect two city council members from each ward, who shall, at the first meeting of the council, decide by lot their terms of office, with one from each ward to hold for a term of 4 years and one for a term of 2 years and until the qualification of their successors. In the succeeding elections, one city council member from each ward must be elected for a 4-year term."

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- NEW SECTION. Section 4. Transition. (1) (a) In a city that divides into new wards pursuant to 7-5-4401:
- (i) the city shall determine and publish new ward boundaries and assign council members pursuant to subsection (1)(a)(iii) by June 1, 2023, to allow citizens who intend to run for the office of council member in the 2023 general election to meet the candidate filing deadline on June 19, 2023;



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1	(11)	a city council member whose term of office ends in January 2024 shall serve out the end of the

3	(iii)	a city council member whose term of office ends in January 2026 shall be appointed to the
4	ward in which the member resides and serve the remainder of the council member's term.

10	(2)	(a) In a city that retains the same number of wards that the city had prior to [this act]:
11	(i)	the council members whose terms of office end in January 2024 shall serve out the end of the
12	term and a successor may not be elected;	
13	(ii)	the offices of the council members whose terms of office end in January 2026 must be filled as
14	follows:	
15	(A)	half of the council members, or a majority of the council members if the total number of council
16	members is ar	odd number, must be elected in the 2025 municipal election to 4-year terms; and
17	(B)	half of the council members, or a minority of the council members if the total number of council
18	members is an odd number, must be elected in the 2025 municipal election to 2-year terms.	
19	(b)	The council members shall decide by lot, in a manner that they select, which members shall
20	hold the office	of council member that expires 2 years after the election as provided for in subsection
21	(2)(a)(ii)(B) an	d which members shall hold office for a term of 4 years as provided in subsection (2)(a)(ii)(A).
22	(c)	The offices of council members elected to 2-year terms as provided in subsection (2)(a)(ii)(B)
23	must be electe	ed to 4-year terms in the 2027 municipal election.
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25	NEW :	SECTION. Section 5. Saving clause. [This act] does not affect rights and duties that matured,
26	penalties that	were incurred, or proceedings that were begun before [the effective date of this act].
