2	INTRODUCED BY J. POMNICHOWSKI

4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO LIFT THE CURRENT EMBARGO AND OTHER
6	TRADE BARRIERS WITH THE REPUBLIC OF CUBA AND EXTENDING A HAND OF FRIENDSHIP TO THE
7	PEOPLE OF CUBA.
8	
9	WHEREAS, for nearly six decades, the United States has maintained, through the most comprehensive
10	set of economic sanctions levied against any nation, a strict embargo with the Republic of Cuba, which places
11	significant restrictions and prohibitions on U.SCuban relationships, especially in trade, travel, and financia
12	transactions; and
13	WHEREAS, U.S. laws and regulations make Montana exports to Cuba difficult and burdensome with
14	numerous federal regulations, including restrictions on credit, that limit the ability of Montana businesses to
15	competitively serve the Cuban market and allowing international competitors to capitalize; and
16	WHEREAS, prior to the embargo the United States accounted for nearly 70 percent of Cuba's
17	international trade, and currently 84 percent of all food consumed in Cuba is imported; and
18	WHEREAS, according to the United States Chamber of Commerce, the embargo's annual cost to the
19	United States economy is \$1.2 billion, and the embargo disproportionately affects United States small businesses
20	that lack the transportation, legal, and financial infrastructure to comply with the current regulations; and
21	WHEREAS, Montana farmers and their world-class agricultural products only need access to markets
22	in order to thrive, and relaxing restrictions and prohibitions on U.S. exports to Cuba will present new opportunities
23	to grow our agricultural sector, create jobs in rural communities across Montana, and enhance Cuban citizens
24	access to affordable food while providing the farm and business community with new markets; and
25	WHEREAS, the United States and Cuba are natural trading partners, and Montana stands ready to be
26	a major source for Cuba's domestic consumption, which will result in significant growth in exports and the creation
27	of more American jobs; and
28	WHEREAS, Americans may not travel to Cuba unless they meet certain federal requirements in order
29	to qualify for a license to travel to Cuba, restricting the right of Americans to travel; and
30	WHEREAS, both Senator Daines and Senator Tester were cosponsors of U.S. Senate Bill 1287, the

1	Freedom for Americans to Travel to Cuba Act, in the 115th Congress; and
2	WHEREAS, despite the hurdles, many of our citizens have visited Cuba and participated in governmental,
3	cultural, and human rights exchanges and that American citizens traveling to Cuba can be the best ambassadors
4	for our way of life and our democratic form of government; and
5	WHEREAS, expanding educational exchanges and cultural interactions would create bridges for us to
6	build on and promote mutual awareness, trust, and respect towards one another; and
7	WHEREAS, since 2008, Cuba has undertaken more than 300 economic reforms designed to encourage
8	private enterprise and small businesses; and
9	WHEREAS, we welcome and encourage openness between our nations and wish to extend the hand
10	of friendship to the people of Cuba.

12	${\tt NOW, THEREFORE, BEITRESOLVEDBYTHESENATEANDTHEHOUSEOFREPRESENTATIVESOFTHE}$
13	STATE OF MONTANA:
14	That the United States Congress be urged to enact legislation lifting the current embargo and other
15	barriers to trade and travel with the Republic of Cuba.
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State send a copy of this resolution to the Majority
17	Leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each
