A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO CONFORM THE STATE'S LAWS CONCERNING HEMP WITH FEDERAL HEMP LAWS.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  SECTION 1. G.S. 90-87, as it reads following the expiration of S.L. 2015-299 pursuant to Section 4 of that act, reads as rewritten:  "§ 90-87. Definitions.  As used in this Article:

 **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) in nonrecurring funds for the 2022-2023 fiscal year to produce educational materials to inform the public of operational changes in the hemp program.

**SECTION 3.** Section 2 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2022. The remainder of this act becomes effective June 30, 2022.
