FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Senate Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1013

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of 2 public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, and the North Dakota vision 3 services - school for the blind; to create and enact a new section to chapter 25-06 and a new 4 section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the school for the blind 5 fund and the school for the deaf fund; to repeal section 6-09-45 of the North Dakota Century 6 Code and section 13 of chapter 49 of the 2015 Session Laws, relating to a required transfer 7 from the Bank of North Dakota and a contingent appropriation; to provide exemptions; to 8 provide for a transfer; to provide for a legislative management study; and to declare an 9 emergency.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, as follows:

5 The 2017-19 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the

6 2019-21 biennium. The department of public instruction, school for the deaf, and North Dakota

7 vision services - school for the blind shall report to the appropriations committees of the

8 sixty-sixth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning

9 July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

10 SECTION 4. TRANSFER - PUBLIC INSTRUCTION FUND TO STATE TUITION FUND.

11 During the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, the office of

12 management and budget shall transfer \$4,282,905 from the public instruction fund to the state

13 tuition fund for the purpose of providing funding for integrated formula payments.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. The sum of \$305,546,905,
included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is
from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund
that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the department of
public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30,
2019.

20 SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - FOUNDATION AID STABILIZATION FUND. The

estimated income line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$270,100,000 from

the foundation aid stabilization fund. Of this amount, \$100,000 is for regional education

association merger grants and \$270,000,000 is for integrated formula payments. Of the total

24 provided, \$160,100,000 is considered to be one-time funding.

SECTION 7. FUNDING TRANSFER - EXEMPTION - AUTHORIZATION. Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the superintendent of public instruction may transfer up to \$1,200,000 from the integrated formula payments line item to the grants - special education line item and up to \$108,000 from the integrated formula payments line item to the grants - transportation line item, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The superintendent of public instruction shall notify the office of management and budget of any transfer made pursuant to this section.

1 SECTION 8. EXEMPTION - ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM FUNDING. The 2 unexpended amount remaining from the transfer of \$1,252,627 from the 2013-15 biennium, as 3 authorized in section 32 of chapter 137 of the 2015 Session Laws to enhance the delivery of 4 and the participation of students and teachers in advanced placement courses during the 2015-5 17 biennium, is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 at the end of the 2015-17 6 biennium and may be continued into the 2017-19 biennium for the purpose of program grants, 7 including leveraging the senior year, leadership program, continuing education grants, 8 preschool continuing education grants, curriculum alignment grants, and teacher and principal 9 evaluation system grants, and to assume the operation and management of the North Dakota 10 leadership and educational administration development center. 11 SECTION 9. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION 12 **CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY.** The superintendent of public instruction may 13 expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education line 14 items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational services that 15 were due in the 2015-17 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly supported by 16 the education provider until after June 30, 2017. To be reimbursed under this section, claims 17 must be properly supported and filed with the superintendent of public instruction by June 30, 18 2018. 19 SECTION 10. GRANTS - SPECIAL EDUCATION DEFICIENCY AUTHORIZATION. If funds 20 provided to the superintendent of public instruction in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for 21 grants - special education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, 22 are not sufficient to meet special education contract obligations, the superintendent of public 23 instruction shall request supplemental funding from the sixty-sixth legislative assembly. 24 SECTION 11. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING -25 **DISTRIBUTION.** 26 The sum of \$800,000, included in the integrated formula payments line item in 1. 27 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts 28 or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an 29 application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the

30 superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall

1 SECTION 14. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATION MERGER GRANTS - ONE-TIME 2 FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION. The line item entitled grants - other grants included in 3 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$100,000 from the foundation aid stabilization fund 4 for the purpose of providing a one-time \$25,000 grant to each regional education association 5 that merges with another regional education association to form a single entity with a single 6 governing board during the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. 7 SECTION 15. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATION GRANTS - DISTRIBUTION. The 8 line item entitled integrated formula payments included in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act 9 includes \$500,000 from the general fund for the purpose of providing annual grants to regional 10 education associations for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. An 11 annual grant of \$31,250 is provided to each regional education association that exists as of 12 July 1, 2017. Regional education associations that merge during the 2017-19 biennium are 13 entitled to the annual grants that would have been paid to each of the member associations. 14 SECTION 16. EXEMPTION - INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION. Notwithstanding section 15 54-44.1-15, the department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its 16 operating account. 17 SECTION 17. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The line item entitled grants in 18 subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,737,528 for aid to public libraries, of which no 19 more than one-half may be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 20 SECTION 18. FEES DEPOSITED IN NORTH DAKOTA VISION SERVICES - SCHOOL 21 FOR THE BLIND OPERATING FUND. Any moneys included in the estimated income line item 22 in subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act, collected for subscription fees or braille fees, must be 23 deposited in the North Dakota vision services - school for the blind operating fund in the state 24 treasury and may be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly. 25 SECTION 19. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF - HIGHER EDUCATION INTERPRETER GRANT 26 **PROGRAM.** The grants line item contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act is for the 27 purpose of providing grants to assist institutions under the control of the state board of higher 28 education with the cost of interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf or 29 hard of hearing, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. Moneys 30 appropriated for this program are not subject to section 54-44.1-11. Funds must be distributed 31 pursuant to the provisions of this section:

1 The school for the deaf shall develop a formula to determine the grant amount for 1. 2 which an institution is eligible. The formula must be based on an uniform hourly 3 reimbursement. 4 2. To obtain a grant under this section, an institution shall submit to the school for the 5 deaf, at the time and in the manner directed by the school, invoices showing the 6 amount expended for interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf 7 or hard of hearing. 8 3. The school for the deaf may not distribute more than fifty percent of the amount 9 appropriated during the first year of the biennium. 10 4. If any grant moneys remain undistributed at the end of the biennium, the school for the 11 deaf shall provide additional prorated grants to institutions that incurred, during the 12 biennium, hourly expenses in excess of the formula reimbursement level. 13 5. At the request of an institution under the control of the state board of higher education, 14 the school for the deaf shall consult with the institution and provide advice regarding 15 the provision of services most appropriate to meet a student's needs. 16 SECTION 20. PASSTHROUGH GRANTS - APPLICATION - DISTRIBUTION -17 **REPORTING.** The line item entitled grants - passthrough grants included in subdivision 1 of 18 section 1 of this Act includes \$3,018,000 for passthrough grants. The superintendent of public 19 instruction shall determine the manner in which each passthrough grant is distributed. 20 Grantees, as a condition of receiving the grant, must establish performance measures to be 21 reviewed by the superintendent of public instruction. Grantees shall report to the superintendent 22 of public instruction regarding performance based on the measures before October 1, 2018. 23 The superintendent of public instruction shall report to the appropriations committees of the 24 sixty-sixth legislative assembly regarding funds granted, performance measures established for 25 each grantee, and whether grantees met performance expectations. 26 SECTION 21. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS. 27 During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the feasibility 28 and desirability of combining services for any or all English language learner programs, 29 distance learning programs, regional education agencies, teacher center networks, adult 30 learning centers, career and technical education programs, education technology services, 31 continuing education for counselors, the North Dakota leadership in educational administration

- 1 development center, and the teacher mentoring program. The legislative management shall
- 2 report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation necessary to implement
- 3 the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth legislative assembly.
- 4 **SECTION 22.** A new section to chapter 25-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 5 and enacted as follows:

6 School for the blind fund.

- 7 The school for the blind fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys received
- 8 pursuant to section 2 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota, revenues received from
- 9 services and leases, and contributions must be deposited in the fund. Moneys in the fund are to
- 10 be used pursuant to legislative appropriation for the provision of services under this chapter.
- 11 SECTION 23. A new section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 12 and enacted as follows:

13 School for the deaf fund.

- 14 The school for the deaf fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys received
- 15 pursuant to section 2 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota and all revenues received
- 16 from the lease of buildings and the provision of meals and services, including interpreter
- 17 services, must be deposited in the fund. Moneys in the fund are to be used pursuant to
- 18 legislative appropriation for provision of services under this chapter.
- 19 SECTION 24. REPEAL. Section 6-09-45 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
- 20 SECTION 25. REPEAL. Section 13 of chapter 49 of the 2015 Session Laws is repealed.
- 21 SECTION 26. EMERGENCY. Sections 7 and 25 of this Act are declared to be emergency

22 measures.
