FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Conference Committee Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1018

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 commerce; to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century

3 Code, relating to a beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program; to provide

4 exemptions; to provide for a legislative management study; to provide for a transfer; to provide

5 for a report; and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
other income, to the department of commerce for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021,
as follows:

5 SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO

6 SIXTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time

7 funding items approved by the sixty-fifth legislative assembly for the 2017-19 biennium and the

8 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

The 2019-21 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget
for the 2021-23 biennium. The department of commerce shall report to the appropriations

27 committees of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the

biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 3. DISCRETIONARY FUNDS - RURAL HEALTH. Of the \$2,150,000 from the
 general fund appropriated in the discretionary funds line item in section 1 of this Act, \$200,000
 is designated for providing matching funds to an organization assisting in the recruitment,

distribution, and supply, and enhancing the quality and efficiency of personnel providing health
 services in rural areas of the state.

3 **SECTION 4. EXEMPTION.** The amount of \$2,200,000 appropriated in the discretionary 4 funds line item in section 1 of chapter 43 of the 2017 Session Laws, of which \$1,200,000 was 5 from the general fund and \$1,000,000 was from the research North Dakota fund, is not subject 6 to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this appropriation are available for 7 discretionary uses during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. 8 SECTION 5. EXEMPTION. The amount of \$2,000,000 appropriated from the strategic 9 investment and improvements fund for the unmanned aircraft systems program in section 1 of 10 chapter 43 of the 2017 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended 11 funds from this program are available for the program during the biennium beginning July 1, 12 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 6. EXEMPTION. The amount of \$1,500,000 appropriated from the general fund
for the early childhood education grant program in section 1 of chapter 43 of the 2017 Session
Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this program are
available for the program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30,
2021.

SECTION 7. TRANSFER - INTERNSHIP FUND. The office of management and budget
 shall transfer \$855,000 of the amount appropriated in the operating expenses line item in
 section 1 of this Act to the internship fund for the purpose of administering the operation intern
 program, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 8. EXEMPTION. The amount of \$950,000 appropriated from the general fund in the operating expenses line item for the operation intern program in section 1 of chapter 43 of the 2017 Session Laws and transferred to the internship fund in section 7 of chapter 43 of the 2017 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this program are available for the program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 9. TRADE OFFICE - MATCHING FUND REQUIREMENT. The North Dakota
 trade office line item and the general fund appropriation in section 1 of this Act include
 \$1,600,000 of funding relating to the North Dakota trade office. The department of commerce
 may spend sixty percent of this amount without requiring any matching funds from the trade

office. Any additional amounts may be spent only to the extent the North Dakota trade office
provides one dollar of matching funds from private or other public sources for each one dollar
provided by the department for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.
Matching funds may include money spent by businesses or organizations to pay salaries to
export assistants, provide training to export assistants, or buy computer equipment as part of
the North Dakota trade office's export assistance program.

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SECTION 10. ENTREPRENEURSHIP GRANTS AND VOUCHER PROGRAM - ONE-TIME

8 FUNDING - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - EXEMPTION.

9 Section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$2,948,467, of which \$740,956 is from the general 10 fund, \$2,000,000 is from the strategic investment and improvements fund, and \$207,511 is from 11 the economic development fund, for an entrepreneurship grants and voucher program to be 12 developed and administered by the department of commerce, for the biennium beginning 13 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. The \$2,000,000 from the strategic investment and 14 improvements fund is considered a one-time funding item. Of the \$2,000,000 from the strategic 15 investment and improvements fund, \$900,000 is to be distributed equally to entrepreneurial 16 centers located in Bismarck, Fargo, and Grand Forks, and \$150,000 is to be distributed to the 17 entrepreneurial center located in Jamestown. The funding for the Jamestown entrepreneurial 18 center may only be provided to the extent the center provides one dollar of matching funds from 19 private or other nonstate sources for each one dollar provided by the department for the 20 biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. The department shall establish 21 guidelines to provide grants to entrepreneurial centers certified by the department. The 22 department also shall establish guidelines to award vouchers to entrepreneurs to procure 23 business development assistance from certified entrepreneurial centers or to provide grants to 24 entrepreneurs working with an entrepreneurial center. The amount appropriated for 25 entrepreneurship grants in section 1 of this Act is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any 26 unexpended funds from this line item are available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, 27 and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 11. BIOTECHNOLOGY GRANT PROGRAM. The grants line item in section 1 of
 this Act includes \$300,000 from the general fund for the purpose of providing biotechnology
 grants to a local association with bioscience experience to promote bioscience and

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- 1 biotechnology research and business development in North Dakota agriculture and life and
- 2 energy science industries.

3 SECTION 12. APPROPRIATION - 2017-19 BIENNIUM - BEYOND VISUAL LINE OF

SIGHT UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM PROGRAM - EXEMPTION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$28,000,000, or so much as the sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of defraying the expenses relating to the beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2019. The funding provided under this section is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds may be continued and are available for the program during the biennium beginning. July 1, 2010, and and ing. June 20, 2021

beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 13. A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is createdand enacted as follows:

14 Beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program - Requirements -

15 **<u>Report to legislative management.</u>**

16 <u>The department may establish and administer a beyond visual line of sight unmanned</u>

- 17 <u>aircraft system program for the design, purchase, implementation, and operating costs of a</u>
- 18 beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system. The department shall require any entity
- 19 receiving funding for this program which is operating the beyond visual line of sight unmanned
- 20 aircraft system to provide quarterly payments to the state treasurer equal to three percent of the
- 21 <u>entity's gross income associated with the operation of the beyond visual line of sight unmanned</u>
- 22 <u>aircraft system as reported in the entity's prior year financial statements. The state treasurer</u>
- 23 shall deposit any funds received under this section in the state general fund. The department

24 shall provide semi-annual reports to the legislative management regarding the development of

- 25 the beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program and the total amount
- 26 <u>deposited by the state treasurer in the state general fund.</u>

27 SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - BEYOND VISUAL LINE OF

28 SIGHT UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM PROGRAM. During the 2019-20 interim, the

29 legislative management shall consider studying the future administration and regulation of the

- 30 unmanned aircraft systems industry in North Dakota, including beyond visual line of sight
- 31 unmanned aircraft system. The study must include a determination of the appropriate state

1 agency or private entity to be assigned responsibility of regulating unmanned aircraft system 2 programs, including licensing, registration, appropriate fees, and other responsibilities. The 3 study may include a review of the audited financial statements associated with the beyond 4 visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system of an entity receiving funding from the 5 appropriation for the beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program in section 9 6 of this Act. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together 7 with any legislation necessary to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-seventh 8 legislative assembly.

9 SECTION 15. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - MOTION PICTURE INCENTIVES. 10 During the 2019-20 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying motion picture 11 incentives. The study must include a review of upper Midwest and neighboring states' statutes 12 on motion picture incentives to assess their successes and challenges; an analysis of the 13 economic impact that would benefit communities through food, lodging, supplies, and 14 transportation; an assessment of existing industry infrastructure in the state and opportunities 15 for growth; and an identification of unique geographic, seasonal, regulatory, and topographical 16 assets the state has for the motion picture industry. The legislative management shall report its 17 findings and recommendations, together with any legislation necessary to implement the 18 recommendations, to the sixty-seventh legislative assembly.

19 SECTION 16. SCULPTURE MAINTENANCE GRANTS - ONE-TIME FUNDING. The grants 20 line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$75,000 from the general fund for the purpose of 21 providing grants, on a reimbursement basis, to maintain the structure and appearance of metal 22 sculptures located adjacent to highways in North Dakota. Grant funds may be awarded only for 23 sculptures with current land leases. The department of commerce shall establish guidelines to 24 require a privately funded maintenance plan to be established for future maintenance cost of 25 metal sculptures adjacent to highways in North Dakota. This funding is considered a one-time 26 funding item.

SECTION 17. NONRESIDENT NURSE EMPLOYMENT RECRUITMENT PROGRAM ONE-TIME FUNDING. The grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$800,000 from the
 general fund for the purpose of establishing a nonresident nurse employment recruitment
 program. The department of commerce shall provide up to \$4,000 in incentives for each
 nonresident licensed nurse who signs a written agreement to work at least four years in a North

Dakota licensed health care facility. Any licensed health care facility receiving funds from this
 program must provide two dollars of incentive matching funds for each one dollar provided by
 the department. This funding is considered a one-time funding item.

4 SECTION 18. TRANSFER - ESTIMATED INCOME- BEGINNING FARMER REVOLVING 5 LOAN FUND - ONE-TIME FUNDING. As requested by the commissioner of the department of 6 commerce, the Bank of North Dakota shall transfer from the beginning farmer revolving loan 7 fund to the department of commerce the sum of \$1,300,000, or so much of the sum as may be 8 necessary, included in the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act for paying 9 intermodal container transportation shipping fees in the event intermodal containers are unable 10 to be shipped, resulting in fees for the transport of containers to new locations for the biennium 11 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. This funding is considered a one-time 12 funding item.

13 SECTION 19. APPROPRIATION - 2017-19 BIENNIUM - NORTH DAKOTA GORGE

14 **PRESERVATION GRANTS - EXEMPTION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the 15 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$750,000, or so much 16 of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of providing 17 grants, on a reimbursement basis, to an organization dedicated to preserving a North Dakota 18 gorge for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2019. 19 Grant funds may be awarded only for expenditures related to the purchase and maintenance of 20 outdoor recreation equipment, the improvement and maintenance of real property, enhancing 21 public access to natural resources, and addressing public safety hazards in a North Dakota 22 gorge. Grant funds may be awarded only to the extent that matching funds on a dollar-for-dollar 23 basis are provided from private or other nonstate sources. Matching funds may include in-kind 24 payments for labor and materials. The funding provided in this section is considered a one-time 25 funding item. The funding provided under this section is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and 26 any unexpended funds may be continued and are available for the program during the biennium 27 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 20. JOB DEVELOPMENT AND ECONOMIC GROWTH GRANT - ONE-TIME
 FUNDING. The grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$25,000 from the general fund
 for the purpose of providing a grant to an organization dedicated to promoting job development
 and economic growth through the purchase of a vacant building previously used to promote job

- 1 development and economic growth for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending
- 2 June 30, 2021. This funding is considered a one-time funding item.
- 3 SECTION 21. EMERGENCY. Sections 12, 13, and 19 of this Act are declared to be an
- 4 emergency measure.
