## **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1259**

1	A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 50-24.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code			
2	relating to medicaid expansion; to provide an expiration date; to provide a contingent expiration			
3	date; and to declare an emergency.			
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:			
5	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 50-24.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
6	amended and reenacted as follows:			
7	50-24.1-37. (Effective January 1, 2014, through July 31, <del>2017</del> 2019) Medicaid			
8	expansi	expansion.		
9	1.	The department of human services shall expand medical assistance coverage as		
10		authorized by the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act [Pub. L. 111-148],		
11		as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 [Pub.		
12		L. 111-152] to individuals under sixty-five years of age with income below one hundred		
13		thirty-eight percent of the federal poverty level, based on modified adjusted gross		
14		income.		
15	2.	The department of human services shall inform new enrollees in the medical		
16		assistance program that benefits may be reduced or eliminated if federal participation		
17		decreases or is eliminated.		
18	3.	The department shall implement the expansion by bidding through private carriers or		
19		utilizing the health insurance exchange. The contract between the department and the		
20		private carrier must:		
21		a. Provide a reimbursement methodology for all medications and dispensing fees		
22		which identifies the minimum amount paid to pharmacy providers for each

medication. The reimbursement methodology, at a minimum, must:

1			(2) Encompass all types of pharmacy providers regardless of whether the	
2			pharmacy benefits are being paid through the private carrier or contractor o	
3			subcontractor of the private carrier under this section.	
4		b.	Provide full transparency of all costs and all rebates in aggregate.	
5		C.	Allow an individual to obtain medication from a pharmacy that provides mail orde	
6			service; however, the contract may not require mail order to be the sole method	
7			of service.	
8		d.	Ensure that pharmacy services obtained in jurisdictions other than this state and	
9			its three contiguous states are subject to prior authorization and reporting to the	
10			department for eligibility verification.	
11		e.	Ensure the payments to pharmacy providers do not include a required payback	
12			amount to the private carrier or one of the private carrier's contractors or	
13			subcontractors which is not representative of the amounts allowed under the	
14			reimbursement methodology provided in subdivision a.	
15		f.	Any information provided to the department of human services or any audit firm	
16			by a pharmacy benefit manager under this section is confidential under section	
17			44-04-17.1.	
18	<u>4.</u>	<u>Effe</u>	ctive July 1, 2017, the department shall align the provider reimbursement rates for	
19		the	medical assistance expansion program to the workforce safety and insurance	
20		<u>rein</u>	bursement rates.	
21	<u>5.</u>	<u>Effe</u>	ctive January 1, 2018, medical assistance expansion program applicants and	
22		<u>reci</u>	pients who are at least nineteen but less than twenty-one years of age must	
23		rece	eive coverage through traditional medical assistance.	
24	<u>6.</u>	The	department shall seek approval of a medicaid waiver to limit coverage under this	
25		sec	ion to the medical assistance expansion population with incomes at or below one	
26		<u>hun</u>	dred percent of the federal poverty level, based on modified adjusted gross	
27		inco	me.	
28	SEC	TIOI	2. EXPIRATION DATE - CONTINGENT EXPIRATION DATE. Section 1 of this	
29	Act is eff	fectiv	e through July 31, 2019, or until the executive director of the department of humar	
30	services certifies to the secretary of state and the legislative council the federal government

- 3 **SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
