## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1283

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 62.1-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,  
2 relating to the carrying of a firearm with a concealed weapons permit; and to declare an  
3 emergency.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 62.1-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 **62.1-02-05. Possession of a firearm at a public gathering - Penalty - Application.**

- 8 1. ~~A person~~An individual who possesses a firearm at a public gathering is guilty of a  
9 class B misdemeanor. For the purpose of this section, "public gathering" includes  
10 athletic or sporting events, schools or school functions, churches or church functions,  
11 political rallies or functions, musical concerts, and individuals in publicly owned parks  
12 where hunting is not allowed by proclamation and publicly owned or operated  
13 buildings. ~~The term "public gathering" does not apply to a state or federal park.~~
- 14 2. This section does not apply to ~~law~~:
- 15 a. A law enforcement officer~~officer~~; ~~members~~
- 16 b. A member of the armed forces of the United States or national guard, organized  
17 reserves, state defense forces, or state guard organizations, when on duty;  
18 ~~competitors~~
- 19 c. A competitor participating in an organized sport shooting ~~event~~event; ~~gun and~~
- 20 d. A gun or antique show~~show~~; ~~participants~~
- 21 e. A participant using a blank cartridge ~~firearms~~firearm at a sporting or theatrical  
22 ~~event~~event; ~~any firearms~~
- 23 f. A firearm carried in a temporary residence or motor vehicle; ~~students and~~  
24 ~~instructors~~

- 1           g. A student and an instructor at a hunter safety classesclass; or private  
2           h. Private security personnel while on duty. In addition, a;  
3           i. A state or federal park;  
4           j. An individual possessing a valid class 1 concealed weapons license from this  
5           state or who has reciprocity under section 62.1-04-03.1 authorizing the individual  
6           to carry a dangerous weapon concealed if the individual is in a church building or  
7           other place of worship and has the approval to carry in the church building or  
8           other place of worship by a primary religious leader of the church or other place  
9           of worship or the governing body of the church or other place of worship. If a  
10          church or other place of worship authorizes an individual to carry a concealed  
11          weapon, local law enforcement must be informed of the name of the authorized  
12          individual; and  
13          k. A municipal court judge licensed to practice law in this state, a district court  
14          judge, a staff member of the office of attorney general, and a retired North Dakota  
15          law enforcement officer are exempt from the prohibition and penalty in  
16          subsection 4, if the individual maintains the same level of firearms proficiency as  
17          is required by the peace officer standards and training board for law enforcement  
18          officers. A local law enforcement agency shall issue a certificate of compliance  
19          under this section to an individual who is proficient.  
20          3. This section does not prevent any political subdivision from enacting an ordinance  
21          which that is less restrictive than this section relating to the possession of firearms at a  
22          public gathering. ~~Such an~~An enacted ordinance supersedes this section within the  
23          jurisdiction of the political subdivision.

24          **SECTION 2. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
